

WANTED: 5M7 2nd Vice District Governor candidate for 2016-17


We as Lions of District 5M7 are looking for someone to run for 2nd VDG for year 2016-17. You must have been a Lions Club President and Lions Zone Chair.

All Lions of Minnesota,

We have been asked for our help. As you know we now have the Volunteer Protection Act which allows us to help others without fear of a possible lawsuit. This law needs to be taken a little further.

In Ohio a Lions Club was holding a pancake fundraiser in an airport hangar. The owner of the hangar took it upon himself to offer free airplane rides to visually impaired persons, without the approval or endorsement of the club. This was nice, but the plane crashed killing 6 people. A judge has ruled that the club is responsible and must pay. They didn't have those kinds of funds and had to fold. Now LCI is being held responsible.

A bill is being introduced to prevent this from happening. Please contact your House representatives and your US Senators and let them know where we stand. Can Do Canines' Lions Newsletter Submission – January, 2016

Thanks to the support of Lions Clubs across 5M, Can Do Canines continues to train specially trained for people with disabilities and provide them to those in need, free of charge.

One recipient of a Can Do Canines assistance dog is 11 year-old Isaiah Kramer. Isaiah has been diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, a degenerative muscle disease that affects every muscle in the body—legs, arms, lungs, heart, and more. Isaiah continues to physically decline, so he now depends on his wheelchair all the time.

Mobility Assist Dog Leo helps Isaiah by picking items that he drops, pulling off his socks and pushing buttons to open handicap doors in public. Below is a letter from Isaiah about how Leo has transformed his life.

I am writing to thank you and everyone at Can Do Canines for giving Leo to me.

Having Leo has changed everything.

Before I met Leo, I was unhappy all of the time because I couldn't do much and I always had to ask for help. My family would be busy and I had to bug them all the time just to pick something up off of the floor for me.

I was nervous and excited to meet Leo for the first time. Leo got used to me right away, but it was also a little scary. He was excited to see me every time we came for training.

Having Leo makes me feel more independent. He picks things up for me, helps me clean my room and carries things for me. I don't have to ask for help from my family as much.

Leo loves to follow me around and loves playing with me. We play Frisbee, tug and fetch together. I love how excited he is when he sees me. He runs to me and jumps around and rubs into me with his back.

I feel safe at night because Leo is there. I sleep better with him next to me.

If I am sad, I can go to Leo and he looks really concerned for me. I can see it in his eyes. He always cheers me up because I can talk to him and he doesn't argue with me.

I felt so lonely before. Now Leo will snuggle up next to me, play with me and make me happy anytime. I don't feel as lonely anymore.

World Diabetes Day Was A Huge Success!

On November 14th, over 1,800 individuals and families participated in World Diabetes Day at local Walmart stores in 8 Minnesota communities- Bemidji, Brooklyn Center, Dilworth, Duluth, Mankato, Marshall, North Rochester and Sartell!

The MN Lions Diabetes Foundation led a pilot community service project on World Diabetes Day to create awareness on diabetes and the increasing numbers of individuals at risk.

World Diabetes Day was created in 1991 by the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) and World Health Organizations in response to the increasing health threat posed by diabetes. This year's theme is "Unite for Diabetes – Act Today for Change Tomorrow". Currently, the IDF reports that one in four people are at risk for diabetes-a staggering statistic.

The MN Lions Diabetes Foundation's goal in participating in this worldwide effort is twofold 1) to help identify those at risk for diabetes and provide information on ways to lower their risk through lifestyle change and 2) to provide education and resources to individuals with type 1 or 2 diabetes.

Fun food and exercise demonstrations for both kids and adults were ongoing at all 8 locations. Certified Diabetes Educators and health professionals were on hand to answer questions and provide information and resources.

Over 1,000 people took the "Are You at Risk" survey provided by the American Diabetes Association. Glucose blood tests were conducted at the Duluth Walmart. Our results showed an even higher risk level than the IDF statistic. We found that approximately 40% of those taking our survey were at risk for diabetes. We are optimistic that the information provided will encourage those at risk to contact their physicians to determine if additional testing is needed and to look at ways to change their lifestyle by eating healthier and getting more exercise.

Along with the MN Lions Diabetes Foundation, World Diabetes Day was sponsored by Novo Nordisk, Walmart, American Diabetes Association, and Stratis Health. The U of MN Extension Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed) demonstrated how to make Farmers Market Salsa which participants sampled and received other healthy recipe ideas.
