







THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU

Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation Helps Lions KidSight MD5M with \$100,000 Donation

On September 27, Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation gave a major boost to Lions KidSight MD5M by donating \$100,000 toward their efforts to screen the vision of children aged six months to six years. As part of a larger Lions Clubs International initiative, Lions KidSight MD5M builds on the Lions' proud history of saving sight and their work to help all persons see the world clearly.

The Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation, established in 1960, has long been concerned about the eye health of children. The foundation helped open the Minnesota Lions Children's Eye Clinic in 1978 and, over the years, has funded extensive remodeling and frequently donated money for needed equipment. At the Lions Children's Eye Clinic, pediatric ophthalmologists and their staff treat more than 8,000 children each year! Efforts are also devoted to pediatric research, including studies in albinism, lazy eye, congenital cataracts, congenital glaucoma, crossed eyes, involuntary eye movement, and retinopathy of prematurity. The clinic's mission is to give every child a lifetime of sight.

But saving a child's sight depends on identifying problems as early as possible. Currently, many young children do not have their vision screened until they start school, and vision problems that are not treated early risk becoming permanent by the age of 7. Lions KidSight MD5M hopes to increase pre-K screening around the state, identifying vision problems and referring children for follow-up treatment with eye care professionals. The Vision Foundation has set them on their way!

OUR FOUNDATION

My Fellow Lions,

Hurricane Matthew affected several areas, including the Caribbean and the United States. It was the deadliest hurricane in the Atlantic Ocean since 2005. Many main roads are impassible and many bridges have been washed away. Food and drinking water are in short supply and many of those who need aid the most are still waiting for it to arrive. When disaster strikes, Lions are among the first to offer help to the victims, even though they are often victims themselves. Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is right there beside them, ready to support their efforts with funding assistance through Lions disaster relief programs. Working together, LCIF, local Lions and Lions leaders assess the urgent needs and quickly deliver the aid most required by victims.

LCIF awarded an initial Emergency grant to Haiti to address immediate needs of disaster victims.

Lions and Leos from Port-au-Prince traveled to Petit-Goåve to work with clubs there. Together, they have packed and distributed over 2,000 relief kits of medicine and food to residents in need.

LCIF has also awarded an Emergency grant to the Lions of 31-N in North Carolina, USA. Lions there are braving the conditions to bring much needed food, water, blankets and medical supplies to those affected most by the storm. More updates about the relief work there is forthcoming.

The situation is dire, but Lions are working to bring hope to their neighbors. You can show your support for Lions and their work by making a donation to LCIF's disaster relief fund today.

Environmental Projects

Rake for the Lake

Autumn has arrived with its cool, crisp nights, bright days and falling leaves. Did you know that tree leaves are a source of phosphorus, the nutrient that turns our lake and rivers green with algae?

In natural settings, phosphorus in the fallen leaves is recycled back into the soil. But, in urban areas, where much of the land is covered by pavement, tree leaves that fall or are raked into the street loose phosphorus into rainwater, which is carried into lakes and rivers through storm sewers

Steps residents can take to reduce the runoff of phosphorus that spurs algae growth are:

- Rake or sweeps leaves from your street and storm drains.
- Compost leaves and grass clippings on location or at a community yard waste collection site. Please do not deposit them into a wetland. Under the MN Wetland Conservation Act (WCA), it is considered a misdemeanor to dispose compost, leaves, grass clippings or anything else that does not originate into the wetland into the wetland.

" UPDATE ON TRAIN" ALL ABOARD FOR THE 2017 LCI INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION

As you know we were trying to work something out with Amtrak as to having a train car for Lions to go to Chicago for the Convention.

PDG Lion Dennis Kelly has contacted Amtrak regarding a train car for Chicago as we had over 75 people interested in taking the train.

So here is what we have learned:

Stops: They cannot make multiple stops. Everyone would need to get on at the same location.

Fare: \$68 each way.

In looking at the price of the fare, it would mean that everyone would have to catch the train in the Twin Cities as that is the fare they show for St. Paul. Everyone would have to make their own reservations.

They also said that if we wanted to have a whole train, we would have to have 250 guests confirmed before they would approve and we would have to work with their Charter Sales people.

Amtrak also said that if requested they will provide a special convention fare for anyone going to the convention from any location; however, they did not elaborate on how this is done. We are thinking that this might be something that LCI would have to arrange with Amtrak.

If we have 75 people who want to leave from the Twin Cities on a specific date and return on a specific date we will have to fill out a Group Travel request and submit to them. They have a 48 hour turnaround time to approve.

We will contact those who have shown interest in taking the train to see if they are still interested and if so we can look into the Group Travel request. Otherwise, our only suggestion is that everyone makes their own reservations with Amtrak and board the train at the location they choose. For those who live West and North of the Twin Cities the cost will be more. You will still need to get a taxi in Chicago to get to your hotel.

We want to thank everyone who showed interest in the train and we wish that Amtrak would have been a little more user friendly.


