An update from Second Vice District Governor Jim Kugler



The goal of every district governor that I can remember has been to either maintain or grow the membership of the district. Most have not succeeded. We're great at getting folks to join our respective clubs, but we lose members faster than we can replace them. Most of the loss comes during the first three years of membership. In fact 36% of new members leave during that time.

Some of the reasons leave may seem obvious like poor meetings, older members not accepting new ideas for service projects, or poor or no programming at club meetings. According to a survey done by Lions International, the primary reason folks leave is the lack of interpersonal relationships. So, what can club members do to make a new Lion feel

comfortable in our club settings? How about asking your new members to become a part of the Lion tamers and have them take attendance at meetings? They will then get to meet all of the club members of the club one by one. Another idea would be to make club meetings more produtive and enjoyable by adopting an agenda that includes speakers from the community combined with speakers from the District. You can also start and end your meetings on time. It's not respectful of folks time when you say a meeting will start at 7:00 and end at 8:30 and neither happen.

Let's make a conscientious to make our new members feel welcome by allowing them to introduce new service projects, even if they have been tried in the past; get them involved with one of your clubs committees; or have the new members sponsor stay in contact with the new member by asking them to meetings and service projects.

The International Convention is a great experience. There are plenty of activities to do along with enough free time to visit the host city. A Lion can participate in seminars, enjoy entertainment shows by fellow Lions and professionals, sign up to help with a community project, walk in or watch the International parade, and more.

T.E.A.M Sheehan will be working to help you with any questions that you might have about attending the convention. Ask your club president or secretary who the T.E.A.M. Sheehan captain is for your district.

The International Convention will be held at the MGM Grand hotel. The delegation hotel for MD5M is the Luxor hotel which is only 15 minutes away and is reasonably



priced. You can find the room rates at lionsclubs.org / LCICON. After January 12, the delegation hotels tend to fill up quickly, so early registration is good.

To register go to Lions clubs international website lionsclubs.org and click LCICON on the right side of the Lions Emblem at the top. There you will find information about the convention. Please visit this website often as LCI updates the information especially closer to the date of the convention which is June 29 – July 3. To find registration information such as fees and forms, click on FOR ATTENDEES in the yellow strip at the top. The early bird registration fee is \$150.00 through January 12, 2018. The deposit for rooms is \$200.00. You can type in your information on the registration form and print it out. You will need your club number and membership number which you should be able to get from your club secretary. You can use one form for both you and your companion that will be sharing a room.

There is a place to enter your arrival date and departure date for the hotel on the registration form. T.E.A.M. Sheehan is working on getting a group flight to Las Vegas at a discounted rate. Go ahead and mark down dates on the form. You can notify LCI if your arrival and departure dates change afterwards just as long as you give them plenty of notice.

This is an exciting time for all of us in MD5M! Let's start to make plans to attend the International Convention in Las Vegas and help elect our own PID Brian Sheehan to the office of 3rd VP! More information such as getting credentials for voting, activities to do, travel plans, etc. will be forthcoming in future newsletters.
