Lions, Lioness, Leos

I just returned from the Council of Governors meeting in Mahnomen and I thought I would cover a few of the topics we discussed. The Minnesota Oral Health Project was given the go ahead by all the District Governors to increase the oral health knowledge across all the counties in greater Minnesota. This is to increase access to oral and dental care to those unmet needs of the underserved children in Minnesota.

We discussed Eyeglass Missions to those parts of the world that need the used eyeglasses that we recycle. Wisconsin Lions have made annual trips to several countries in Central and South America and will help us with any mission trips

we would like to make. They stated when they go on a trip that will take 12,000 pair of glasses to the country and try to fit 3,000-4,000 patients. They have a need for 'readers' and sunglasses also. We are going to survey the other districts in the multiple and see if there are other districts also on these missions and maybe start one from the metro area.

The Minnesota Lions Eye Bank is making a name change to- 'Lions Gift of Sight'. This is being done to better reflect what Lions are doing giving the sight to those in need. It will also help with the calls that are made to the donor's families at the time of the donors passing. Some of the families were a little confused when they heard Lions Eye "bank," thinking we were asking for donations of money and not the deceased eye tissue, so that is the need for the name change.

The Centennial Celebration will for sure will be happening at the Anoka County Fairgrounds next year on Sunday June 10th. We will estimate that we should be able to have an attendance of 3,000-6,000 Lions there for the event. It is planned to start at 8 a.m. with the largest pancake breakfast ever to be held in this area. We will also have a little red wagon parade, packaging food for 2nd Harvest and Feed My Starving Children, live music, a'Lions only' car show, games for kids, *Continued on next page*...

avenues of service for Lions projects, and a whole lot more. If you have more questions, email md5m100years@gmail.com.



An update from Second Vice District Governor Jim Kugler



This is a rhetorical question, what is your favorite charity. Monetarily, for me it would be the church. St. Philips gets most for money. Other organizations include the local high school, scouts, Cars for Neighbors and the list goes on and on. LCIF is not on my radar for financial consideration. Should it be? What organizations get most of my time, the answer would be my lion's club, the chamber and church.

If I were to ask that same question from the club's perspective, the organizations would change and would include LCIF, the hearing and vision foundations, Can Do Canines and the list goes on and on. Having said all of that, the question is, should LCIF be our charity of choice? LCIF has four areas of focus: sight preservations, disaster relief,

youth and areas of greatest need. The areas of greatest need allows LCIF the greatest flexibility in meeting needs that are most urgent.

I know as part of the Parade of Green, clubs give monies to LCIF. Here's some information for your consideration. Since 1968, 5M7 has contributed \$1,761,294 to LCIF. During that same period LCIF has awarded \$516, 484.01 in grants. No matching grant has been denied in that time. Grants have been denied when the organizations requesting the grant did not raise the money they said they would to qualify for the grant. The multiple distract has raised \$13,149,752 and has received \$5,810,651 in grants during that same period.

Should LCIF, be a bigger part of our club and individual charitable giving program?

With our latest project, the Lions Eye Institute @ the University of Minnesota, your financial support of the Foundation is even more vital. When you or your club is making a donation, please make all your checks out to the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation or MLVF. You can indicate the Foundation program you wish to support towards, such as the Lions Eye Institute (LEI), the Minnesota Lions Eye Bank (MLEB), the Minnesota Lions Children's Eye Clinic (MLCEC), the Minnesota Lions Macular Degeneration Research and Rehabilitation Center (The MAC), the vision research at the Lions Research Building (LRB), or the Minnesota Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center (MLERC), in the Memo section on the check.

Used Eyewear Collection

The other Mid-Winter Convention reminder for you is concerning used eyewear. PDG Paul and Lion Lyle will have a booth set up in the main hall of the hotel. Besides having information and promotional items for you to pick up, this booth will be accepting used eyewear for recycling and re-distribution. The Minnesota Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center (MLERC) will be sending a truck and trailer to collect any used eyewear the Lions of 5M-7 bring to the convention. Now is the time to pack up that eyewear you've been picking up at your collection sites and to bring it down to the Mid-Winter. The MLERC can accept prescription eyeglasses (frames with lenses intact), non-prescription sunglasses, and reading glasses. (No lenses without frames or frames without lenses, please). Let's fill that trailer and the only way to do that is by bringing those eyeglasses to Bloomington!

National Donor Sabbath

National Donor Sabbath is observed annually two weekends before Thanksgiving, from Friday through Sunday. This three-day observance will take place on November 10th to 12th, 2017 and seeks to include the days of worship for major religions practiced in the United States. During the National Donor Sabbath, faith leaders from many religions, donor families, transplant recipients, and donation and transplantation professionals participate in services and programs to educate the public about the need for the lifesaving and healing gifts passed to others through transplantation, while also encouraging people to register their decision to be an organ, eye and tissue donors. Please speak to your family, friends and acquaintances about the importance of making the decision to make the gift of life. A great way to celebrate the National Donor Sabbath is to become an organ, eye and tissue donor.

Global Service Team Message

There is a new position in Lions this year. It is labeled as "Global Service Team Coordinator". My responsibilities are to encourage clubs to complete the five (5) focus service areas that Lions Clubs International (LCI) have designated for us to work on this year. They are:

1. Diabetes. This is a new project taken on at the International

Convention in Chicago in July. Each club is asked to do some kind of Diabetes project. Try contacting a local pharmacy or clinic for ideas. Many clinics have a Diabetic Educator and/or Nutritionist. Many are willing to help.

- 2. Environment. This can be as simple as cleaning up a park or a roadside ditch. Does your club have a designated area to keep clean and uncluttered? If not, perhaps it is something to discuss. It could involve a reforestation project or starting a community garden.
- 3. Vision. An easy one here is to sponsor a screening of kids vision thru the 5M7 KidSight *Continued on next page* . . . "We Serve"

program. This is really easy. You will need a chairperson or two, then contact any preschool or daycare places in your area. The screening involves kids from 6 months to 6 years. Permission slips are required. Or contact your local school nurse and offer to buy glasses for kids whose parents can't afford them.

- 4. Hunger relief. Do a food collection for your local food shelf. I know of a club that takes one neighborhood and passes out bags one Saturday and picks them up the following Saturday, hoping they have been filled with groceries. Do a shift at "Feed our Starving Children". Check with your school district for any programs for kids hunger.
- 5. Children's pediatric cancer. Lions clubs can collect books or other learning materials or make blankets to donate to cancer clinics in your area. Have a special fundraiser. Check with local clinics for anything they may need. This is an emotional one. Nobody wants to see kids have cancer.

When clubs complete a project, make sure you report it to "MyLCI" and make sure they note which subject was served.

ALSO, please make sure your club secretaries to go to the officer listing site at International and scroll down and add these two club positions and for the club presidents to fill those positions.

- 1. Club Service Chair
- 2. Club LCIF Coordinator

This needs to be done ASAP.

There is a nomination fee of \$150. For each candidate nominated and must accompany the nomination to the District Governor. All nominations must be received to the District Governor no later than 30 days, prior to our MidWinter Convention, no later than December 18th.

And the . . .

The Lion Al Jensen Leadership Award

Selection Process:

- One or two awards may be presented annually to Lions who have been members for five years or more
- The candidates selection must be based only on contribution efforts at the District or Multiple Level
- Each District governor shall annually nominate no more than on Lion to receive the award
- The nomination must be on the official nomination form, signed by the District Governor and submitted to the Council Chair each year no later than March 1st.
- Final selection of the award recipients shall be made by a committee of seated Council Chair and the two previous Council Chairs

This award shall be presented to the most qualified Lions nominated for the award based on the following Leadership Characteristics, Vision, Creativity, Courage, Initiative, Unselfishness, Teamwork, and Effectiveness in leading others. Dear Lions,

Ever since Helen Keller challenged Lions to become "knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness," Lions have done just that. Lions have dedicated much of their work to restoring vision and fighting preventable blindness alongside Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) and its partners. In recognition of October's World Sight Day, let's celebrate the vision-saving accomplishments of Lions and LCIF working together. Since the founding of SightFirst, LCIF has awarded 1,287 SightFirst grants totaling US\$342.6 million. SightFirst initiatives take place in more than 100 countries across the globe.

SightFirst's work led to the elimination of river blindness in Guatemala, it restored sight to more than 7 million people with cataracts, and prevented serious vision loss for more than 30 million people. In addition to the outstanding work SightFirst is achieving, LCIF has many partnerships that are succeeding in saving sight for people of all ages, including Sight for Kids, a partnership with Johnson & Johnson Vision Care; Opening Eyes, a partnership with Special Olympics International; and the Project for the Elimination of Childhood Blindness, a partnership with the World Health Organization.

Lions, as you plan your clubs' service projects and think of ways LCIF could boost your impact, keep in mind our battle against preventable blindness. With estimates showing that 80% of blindness or visual impairment can be prevented, remember that while we have accomplished great things, there is still much work to be done. I know you will join me in continuing the "crusade against darkness."

Clubs using MyLCI can assign their club delegates at any time between January 1 and June 28, 2017.

Clubs using the <u>Club Delegate Form</u> to assign their delegates will need to mail the form to International Headquarters by May 1, 2017. If you are not able to mail the form by May 1, 2017 bring signed form to the convention site. The <u>form</u> will also be available in *The Lion* (February & April issues).

How many delegates are allowed for my club?

Each club is allowed one delegate for every 25 members or major fraction thereof. See International Convention Club Delegate Entitlement Table.

Are there additional requirements?

All delegates must be registered for the international convention, and pay the full registration fee.

I've arrived at the convention center. How do I vote?

The process of certification and voting has been changed. At the 2017 International Convention certification and voting will occur at the same time in the convention Voting Area. As soon as you are certified, you will receive a ballot and will be able to vote immediately. Certification and Voting days and times are:

- Sunday, July 2, 1:00 PM 8:00 PM (13:00 20:00)
- Monday, July 3, 9:00 AM 8:00 PM (09:00 20:00)
- Tuesday, July 4, 7:30 AM 10:30 AM (07:30 10:30)

In addition to a government-issued photo ID, the delegate will need one of the following:

- Printed Delegate Confirmation
- Signed Delegate Form
- Authorizing club* or district** officer

Certification and Voting Frequently Asked Questions

Clubs using the <u>Club Delegate Form</u> to assign club delegates – can change a delegate, by mailing the form, to LCI headquarters, by May 1.

At the convention site - a new delegate can be assigned in the Voting Area. The new delegate will need to be accompanied by an authorized club officer* or district officer* and both the delegate and officer will need to provide a government-issued photo ID.

I forgot my Delegate Confirmation. What should I do?

Simply, bring your government-issued photo ID to the Voting Area.
