Happy 20th Anniversary to the MAC!

This year marks the 20th Anniversary to one of the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation's major projects. In 1998, the MLVF and Lions of Minnesota pledged to fight the leading cause of blindness in the developed world – macular degeneration. They gave \$2.5 Million to the University of Minnesota to establish the *Minnesota Lions Macular Degeneration Research and Rehabilitation Center (The MAC)* and to change the outlook for those who suffer from macular degeneration.

Macular degeneration is a disease of the retina that causes permanent loss to the central vision, and by age 75, nearly one-third of all Americans will experience some degree of age-related macular degeneration (AMD). For the elderly, this loss of sight is especially tragic since many are already dealing with other physical limitations. With an ever-aging population, the cases of AMD will grow significantly over the course of the next several years.

The MAC gathers together the expertise of physicians, the work of researchers from many university departments, the hands-on knowledge of representatives from the medical technology industry, and the resources and energy of the Lions. This invaluable collaboration is the key to treating and curing macular degeneration.

We Lions should be proud of the support we've given to these dedicated doctors and researchers at the U of M. Through our generous contributions, strides are being made to diagnose and treat AMD. The ultimate goal is to cure or prevent this debilitating disease from plaguing future generations. Hopefully, your children and grandchildren will live in a time when macular degeneration is nothing more than the name of an illness found in the history books.

Hello Lions,

For the past year I have been working on eyeglass missions to central America. This past February I attended a mission to Nicaragua with the Wisconsin Lions Missions. They have been doing missions to Nicaragua for 25 years.

Working 5 days, we served about 4000 people with eyeglasses and changed their lives. It also changed my life. It is the most worthwhile thing I have ever done. That week of service made me a Lions all over again. Since then, there

has some political strife happened in Nicaragua and over 300 people have been killed. Our contact down there is in hiding and his house was fire bombed. He is trying to get himself and his family out of the country.

So, there will be no missions down there for the foreseeable future.

About a month ago Lion Steve McCabe, the mission coordinator for Nicaragua, called me and volunteered to help me organize the Minnesota Lions Eyeglass Missions. We will be using the same contact as Wisconsin uses for their missions to El Salvador. His name is Diego. Diego has selected the city of Antigua for our first mission to Guatemala and the tentative date is early March of 2020. I have gotten on the mission to El Salvador in 2019 and right after that mission, Lion Steve, Diego, and myself plan to fly to Guatemala and go to Antigua. Once there we will meet with the local Lions Club we will be working with and check out the facilities, hotels, security, andcont a whole bunch of other things we need to know before we can conduct a mission down there. I have been to Antigua and it is an old city, but rather scenic. Should be a great mission. Going on a mission costs each individual Lion about \$1500 depending on airfare. We go to SERVE!

GLOBAL SERVICE TEAM REPORT

Last year LCI initiated a new program called the Global Service Team as part of the Global Action Team.

The goal was to give clubs 5 SERVICE projects that are actually “hands on projects”. Not money making projects. The subjects are Hunger, Diabetes, Youth Cancer, Environment, and Vision. The kicker is that all clubs are to have a special “Club Service Chairperson” to head up these 5 service projects.

People join Lions Clubs to SERVE. They do not join Lions Clubs to raise money. Think about it.

Do you get the “feel good” feeling for raising money? I don’t think so. We get the “feel good” feeling for doing something for somebody else with no strings attached. No reward expected or received, but something that really helped somebody else.

Now, these hands on service projects have to be reported to LCI and the club service chair can do it. It doesn’t have to be the club secretary. The club service chair can do it. The goal of LCI is to serve 200,000,000 people per year. They need us, the Lions clubs, to report these service projects. Governor Al wants to see 75% of the clubs in 5M7 to have Club Service Chairpersons by the MidWinter Convention in January, 2019. So, come on Lions, let’s get to work.
