

Things on my mind: Vice District Governor Jim Kugler

Several years ago, I was asked to join my local lion's club. Other than my sponsor I did not know many other folks in the club. Now over the years these folks I did not know, I now consider friends. As President Yngvadottir states: there is nothing that can bond people more closely than working together to help others. Lions International has a goal of serving 200 million people a year. So, a side benefit of being a member of your local lion's club is friendship with other club members.

Part of that friendship comes with a price. That price can be happiness when a member gets married, has a child or grandchild or has something to celebrate like a 25th wedding anniversary. The price can also help families grieve the loss of a loved one or a prolonged illness. We have become part of an extended lion's family.

We, as lions, can bring happiness to folks we do not even know. There are countless examples of where our clubs have helped, but I want to focus on just one, Joshua. Joshua was born with autism. As most of us know, a child can express themselves by throwing temper tantrums. These will usually go away within a short period of time. With Joshua, these tantrums could go on for hours. There was nothing the parents could do for the child. And then along came Maggie an 18-month-old black lab.

Before Maggie, Joshua's tantrums could be triggered by a loud sound, a flash of light or sudden movement. Because these events could not be controlled, the family was almost totally restricted to their home. The family could not go out: shopping, to church, go out for pizza or go on vacation.

Then Can-Do Canines entered the picture. They had trained Maggie to be a service dog for children with autism. Shortly after introducing Maggie to Joshua, Joshua's behavior began to change. The family can go anywhere as a family. Maggie can now help Joshua manage his autism. Can-do Canines along with the support of the lions has now brought happiness to Joshua and his family.

The monies, we, as clubs contribute through organizations such LCIF, Leader Dog, Can-do Canines, the vision and hearing foundations, all help bring some degree to happiness to folks we may never know or meet. As clubs we serve our local communities but also our world community.

The story of Joshua is just one story. There are thousands of stories like Joshua's, but are we telling these stories to our respective communities. Our motto is We Serve. In order to be of more service, we need to continue to replace those members leaving our clubs but also increase our club membership Let's try to have a net growth of one member per club at the end of this lion's year.




On Friday, October 19th from 10 a.m.-1 p.m., the Scandia-Marine Lions Club offered a Service Project Sampler Day. Leos from the Forest Lake-Scandia Leo Club played an key role in this event by helping with set-up; overseeing service projects; instructing attendees how to do the activities as well as doing a variety of service projects themselves; cleaning up; and delivering items to various non-profits.

This well-attended event was designed to offer service opportunities to club members and other Lions as well as reach potential new members in the community (particularly women and teens). We were very happy that we had two new Leos join the Forest Lake-Scandia Leo Club during the event!

After two hours of volunteering, volunteers enjoyed a diabetes-friendly lunch while Scandia-Marine Lions Club

President Lynnette Welsch gave a presentation about the Lions

Made 25 pairs of shoes for Sole
Hope to give to children in Uganda who are medically treated for jiggers (insects that can cripple and kill those who have them) so they can walk, play, and go to school again.
Assembled 21 medical care kits for Sole Hope to gie to people who are

treated with jiggers in Uganda so they can

do at-home follow-up care to prevent jiggers from returning.

- Packed 1 box of medical supplies for Sole Hope to use in the medical center for people being treated with severe and life-threatening cases of jiggers in Uganda.

- Packaged 865 glasses that were donated to the Scandia-Marine Lions that will be refurbished and given to those in need in the U.S. and world.

- Packaged 30 hearing aids that were donated to the Scandia-

Marine Lions that will be refurbished and given to those in need in the U.S. and world.

- Donated 55.82 pounds of food to Scandia-Marine Food Shelf.

- Wrote encouraging messages on 20 holiday cards to prisoners in the U.S. – most of whom have done non-violent crimes; some who are wrongfully convicted and serving crimes that they didn't commit; and others who have been shunned by their families and have no contact with the outside world.

Wrote 14 letters to send to Operation Gratitude which will be sent to deployed troops, new recruits, first responders, and veterans.
Colored 97 sheets for Color-a-Smile that will send them to seniors in nursing homes, the homebound, veterans, and service men and women who need encouragement and cheering up.

- Knitted 3 hats for newborn babies at Fairview Hospital in Wyoming, Minnesota.

- Created 16 birthday bags that Scandia-Marine Food Shelf and Family Pathways Food Shelf in Forest Lake will give to families who have a child with a birthday for which they can't afford to purchase supplies (e.g., cake, icing, candles, birthday table décor, card, gifts).

- Put bookplates in 12 books about key issues that the Lions support (e.g., diabetes, vision/blindness, the environment, pediatric cancer), The books will be donated to Scandia Elementary School, River Grove Elementary School, Elim Lutheran Church, and Christ Lutheran Church.

- Donated 60 pieces of jewelry to I Have Wings that will refurbish and sell them; and give the proceeds to programs that help women who have breast cancer.

- Donated 92 books for the Minnesota Literacy Council that will give

LITPC YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The Lions International Trading Pin Club (LITPC) has announced for the 2018-2019 school year that there will be 3 US \$2,500 scholarships awarded. Graduating Leos OR graduating sons/daughters, grandsons/granddaughters of Lions or Lioness are

eligible to apply for the LITPC Youth Scholarship. The most important aspect of the Youth Scholarship Program is to help a young person pursue his/her education and follow their dreams. The 2019 recipients will be announced at the Pin Traders Annual Breakfast in June, 2019.

Selection of the scholarship recipients will be based on academic achievement, an essay stating the student's goals, a statement of reason(s) for applying and an overview of work, community and school service, and letters of recommendation.

The current forms for the scholarships are available on line at <u>www.litpc.org</u> In the right column, **click on LITPC Scholarship Information**. Then **click on Scholarship Application Form**. Please follow the instructions, fill out **ALL** the forms neatly and correctly which includes the 4 essay questions (in 350 words or less) and the question about scholarships that you have been offered along with submitting a certified copy of your high school transcript including activities. Plus you also need to attach recommendations from 2 persons (i.e. teacher, coach, clergy, employer, etc.) **AND** attach a recommendation letter from a Lions Club member indicating the name of the Club and state/province and country in which the Club is located.



Overall Numbers, Diabetes and Prediabetes

- **Prevalence**: In 2015, 30.3 million Americans, or 9.4% of the population, had diabetes.
 - \circ Approximately 1.25 million American children and adults have type 1 diabetes.
- **Undiagnosed**: Of the 30.3 million adults with diabetes, 23.1 million were diagnosed, and 7.2 million were undiagnosed.
- **Prevalence in Seniors**: The percentage of Americans age 65 and older remains high, at 25.2%, or 12.0 million seniors (diagnosed and undiagnosed).
- New Cases: 1.5 million Americans are diagnosed with diabetes every year.
- Prediabetes: In 2015, 84.1 million Americans age 18 and older had prediabetes.
- **Deaths**: Diabetes remains the 7th leading cause of death in the United States in 2015, with 79,535 death certificates listing it as the underlying cause of death, and a total of 252,806 death certificates listing diabetes as an underlying or contributing cause of death.

Diabetes in Youth

- About 193,000 Americans under age 20 are estimated to have diagnosed diabetes, approximately 0.24% of that population.
- In 2011—2012, the annual incidence of diagnosed diabetes in youth was estimated at 17,900 with type 1 diabetes, 5,300 with type 2 diabetes.
