Things are beginning to get back on a normal track. What with the International convention and vacation, I've lost all track of track of what a normal day should like.

Lots of stuff going on at the International convention. There are a couple of main take a ways. First, Lion Patti Hill, from Canada, was elected 3rd Vice

President. This was a contested race but Lion Patti was the victor.

The board approved adding another constitutional area, Africa. This will be area 8. The board also approved expanding the number of international directors from the current 34 to 35 directors.

President Choi has a couple of major goals: increasing membership and raising three hundred million American dollars for LCIF. All of the sitting district governors have made a pledge to individually support Campaign 100 to help meet the \$300,000,000LCIF goal.

Growth for lion's international will come from increasing the number of clubs and by re-energizing existing clubs. Skeptics may not think these goals are possible. The kick off speaker was a Dr. Piccard who championed the first around the world flight with a battery powered plane. It took him twelve years to accomplish that goal. If he can fly around the world with a battery we can increase membership and reach the three million dollar goal.

The district has goals for membership, leadership development, service and participation with our foundation. A guy by the name of Melvin Jones thought business people should give back to their communities. We started as a service organization so that is where I'd like to begin this year by concentrating on service. One of the things I'm asking of each club president is to tell me what is their club's signature service event and how many people were served by that event. Does anyone want a dollar? Ask me. I'm convinced that folks join the lions to serve and not go to meetings. So service is a theme for this year. Feed my Starving Children will be the focus of that service theme.

Clubs serve their communities. LCI's community is the world. In order to meet those global challenges, LCI needs money. As a district goal, I'm asking each club to make some kind of a contribution to LCIF. The district does get monies back from LCI in the form of grants. The two most recent grants were for making facilities accessible to folks with physical challenges. Camp Friendship received \$100,000 and most recently Blaine received \$100,000 to refurbish a ball park making it accessible to folks who have limited physical abilities. As individuals and as clubs we should make an effort to support our foundation LCIF.

I'm looking forward to this year. Let's serve our communities both local and international and have some fun and fellowship along the way.

Minnesota's official state bee: The Rusty Patched Bumblebee was once a widespread pollinator and is "the first bee in the contiguous United States to be listed as endangered," said Elaine Evans, a bumblebee expert with the University of Minnesota Bee Squad. This designation is a way to protect the bee population.

It is hard to figure out what is going wrong within the ecosystem for the population of bees and butterflies to decline. Some experts believe it could be a combination of disease, habitat loss and pesticides.

The Rusty Patched Bumblebee needs blooming flowers available from early spring through the fall. In addition, the bee needs a place to nest. If you are able to leave an area of your yard undisturbed and make a wood pile or a pile of leaves, this could be a couple of simple steps for making sure that the Rusty Patched Bumblebees and other pollinators can thrive, grow and recover.

Remember we all need food!

MD5M Lions KidSight Foundation, Inc Minnesota State Fair 2019 Job Descriptions

Team Lead: This would be the District Director

Vision Screener: (2 positions) This Lion will be responsible for doing the vision screening using either of our screening systems, the Welch Allyn SPOT or the PlusOptix.

Greeter: (2 positions) This Lion will be responsible for standing in front of the booth and greeting people with children asking them if they would like to have their children's vision checked. They will carry a clip board with the consent forms and will instruct the parent or guardian in the correct manner to complete the form. They will check the form for legibility and completeness. They will hold the family in the outside area until a vision screener Lion is ready for them. They will then pass the paperwork and the family to the escort Lion.

Escort: (2 positions) The Escort Lion will receive the consent form from the Greeter. They will bring the family or child to the vision screening position. Once the screening is complete, they will hand the appropriate form to the parent along with the screening explanation sheet.

If the result is a non-refer, they will hand the non-refer form to the parent and thank them for having their child's eyesight screened. They will then place the consent form in the appropriate box. They will then proceed to the next waiting family.

If the result is a refer, they will have the parent complete the required items on the consent form. They will hand the parent the refer letter, the printout of the screening results and the explanation of screening form. They will then file the consent form in the appropriate box. They will then proceed to the next waiting family.

Hawker: (1 position) This Lion will work outside the Health Fair 11 building telling passing families of the vision screening that is happening inside the building and inviting them to come in.

Can Do Canines continues to celebrate their 30^{th} anniversary and has a great video on YouTube summarizing their amazing journey over the years. Check it out at: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8aWiPdl hGE

For the 2018-2019 Lions Club year, Lions Clubs in District 5M7 donated \$68,873 keeping us in 1^{st} place again. While this is great news, the donations were made by only 72% of the Clubs in our district (8^{th} place of the 11 Districts). My goal is to work with the Lions Clubs in 5M7 and strive for 100% participation in 2019-2020. We have 20 clubs with charitable gambling programs and hope these and all clubs will put Can Do Canines on their donation recipient list this year.

With over 184 clients on the waiting list, the need still exists for training and placing assistance dogs with deserving people. There is one client in Coon Rapids with a dog in training for 2019 and two clients in our district (St. Michael and Coon Rapids) who are approved and waiting for a dog. Of the 274 active graduate teams, there are 56 teams in District 5M7 = #3 (only behind 81 teams in District 5M1 and 61 teams in District 5M6). You and your clubs are helping get the word out about Can Do Canines and the value these dogs provide to people with hearing, mobility, seizure, diabetes and autism concerns.

I cannot stress enough the fact that clients only pay a \$50 application fee and it costs \$25,000 to train and place a dog from start to finish. Let's help Can Do Canines attain their goal and train more dogs to graduate through their programs and place with their clients.

September 14th Can Do Woofaroo at 10 am to 2 pm - A fabulous day to join with fellow Can Do Canines supporters for a leisurely walk around the block near the CDC office in New Hope. Come out to enjoy great food (donated by Jim of Wagners Drive-In, a fellow Lions Club member, enjoy fun events and shop the wonderful vendors. This is one of their fundraisers of the year, and best of all, this year it is totally sponsored by the LCI! LIONS PARK

Improvements to Lions Park are nearing completion. There is a rock wall to hold the shoreline in place by the park area, new sidewalk to allow entrance to the beach area, and a run off filtration area to help filter run off water before it goes back into the lake. They say that active volunteers wear many hats. That's not the case with Larry Kounkel. He wears just one hat during his many volunteer duties—his cowboy hat.


Larry has about 20 cowboy hats. He wears black hats in the winter and a gray cowboy hat in the spring and fall.
