Past Allied Charities of Minnesota member,

I am writing to you today to ask you to consider renewing your membership in ACM.

ACM represents everyone who conducts licensed charitable gaming in Minnesota.

While our sales and taxes have more than doubled in the past seven years, our profit for mission and community has not come close to doubling.

In the past seven fiscal years we have lost half of what we made per dollar wagered in 2012.

As a group, since 2017 we now work longer for the state than we do for our community and mission.

We are currently losing 6 to 7% of our ability to help those in need annually. That needs to stop.

ACM is the only group that is working to reverse these trends to keep charitable gaming relevant across the entire state.

ACM is a fiscally responsible organization. I am the only person on staff. We do hire accounting help (on an hourly basis) to write checks and do our books (a good safe guard and stewardship of dues).

ACM hires lobbyist help at the legislature to help with legislation.

ACM has an attorney on retainer that offers no cost consultation to charities in need of legal advice and who monitors rule/policy changes and fights for charities at the Gambling Control Board.

ACM has kept dues as low as possible. Our dues of \$275 per year are the equivalent of 75 cents per day.

ACM works only for charities that are licensed to conduct gaming. We have no other agenda or loyalties.

While it is hard to quantify the value of an ACM membership, I know that without ACM working to right what is wrong with charitable gaming; charities would be in worse shape than they are today.

In a very real sense ACM is low cost insurance that someone is watching out for your organization.

Please consider renewing your membership. Call me with any questions you have, I am the only one answering when you call ACM.



### **Lions Gift of Sight**



Nearly sixty years ago, two organizations—the University of Minnesota and the Lions combined their aspirations and their resources to create the Lions Gift of Sight (formerly known as Minnesota Lions Eye Bank). Both organizations recognized they held the common interest of serving the people of Minnesota, and one way to act on this service was to give the

state an eye bank.

Dr. Harris, chair of the Department of Ophthalmology, laid the groundwork for an eye bank by developing a plan to approach the families of deceased patients at University of Minnesota-affiliated hospitals about donating their loved ones' eyes. He then worked with the School of Mortuary Science to establish a mutually acceptable technique for removing donor eyes.

Austin Lions club member, George Dugan, solicited Lions club support across the state and arranged financial backing. Thanks to Mr. Dugan's efforts, Minnesota Lions, at their annual meeting in June 1960, unanimously adopted the eye bank resolution, and the Lions Gift of Sight was born.



In the spring of 1961, Minnesota Lions presented the University with a check for \$6,400, representing a pledge of \$1.00 per Lions member. The Lions contributions increased regularly as the eye bank program expanded, and today Lions donations top \$250,000 per year. These donations support not just the eye bank, but also help the Lions Children's Eye Clinic, the Lions Macular Degeneration Center, the MN Lions Eye Surgery Center and eye research efforts at the Lions Research Building.

Since its inception, the Lions Gift of Sight has provided corneas for more than 35,000 transplant surgeries. Across the world, countless people have been helped by more than 11,000 eyes provided by our eye bank for research that leads to the development of treatments and cures. All of these accomplishments came about because of Lions and doctors coming together many years ago to what has become one of the top eye banks in the world.

### Thanksgiving for Vision



Attending the event *Thanksgiving for Vision* is something we all hope to accomplish on our Lions' bucket list. **This year's event is taking place on Saturday, October 26, 2019 at the Earle Brown Heritage Center in Brooklyn Center.** All of the 5M-7 club presidents will be receiving invitations to this event. We encourage your attendance and, if your club president and their guest cannot attend, we encourage your club to send a representative and a guest to honor the invitation. If you have a long-

serving club member or a new Lion who has never been to *Thanksgiving for Vision*, it is your choice on who could benefit the most by coming to this event.

It is very special to know that the doctors and staff of the Department of Ophthalmology take time every autumn to thank the Lions in this way. This event is a celebration of restored vision. The morning begins with an educational seminar focusing on the research being done at the University. A wonderful luncheon follows featuring inspirational speeches by a donor family representative and a corneal transplant recipient. These people directly benefited from the research and clinics at the U of M, which are supported by you Lions. This event is guaranteed to make you feel glad that you are a Lion! # Journey of Peace

Your club can sponsor visually-impaired students in the Lions Clubs International Essay Contest!

The contest is open to students who are considered visually impaired according to their national guidelines, and will be 11, 12 or 13 years of age on November 15, 2019. Eligible birthdates are November 16, 2005 through November 15, 2008. One grand prize winner will receive an award and US\$5,000.

The contest theme is "Journey of Peace."

- Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest. The contest may be sponsored in a local school or organized, sponsored youth group, or individuals may be sponsored as well.
- Essays must be no longer than 500 words, submitted in English, typewritten in black ink and double spaced.
- Each essay must be submitted with a completed entry form. Essays submitted without completed entry forms will be disqualified.
- Only one entry per student per year, and each entry must be the work of only one student.
- Essay entries cannot have already been published.
- Any essays found to be plagiarized will be disqualified, and the student will be prohibited from entering any future Lions competitions.

### DEADLINES

**November 15, 2019** – Postmark deadline for a club to send one winning essay to the district governor. **Note:** A participating club should notify its district governor in advance of sending an entry.

**December 1, 2019** – Postmark deadline for a club not belonging to a district to send one winning entry directly to Brand & Marketing Strategy at Lions Clubs International.

**December 1, 2019** – Postmark deadline for a district to send one winning essay to the multiple district council chairperson. A district not belonging to a multiple district must send its entries directly to Brand & Marketing Strategy at Lions Clubs International (postmarked by December 1).

**December 15, 2019** – Postmark deadline for a multiple district to send one winning essay to Brand & Marketing Strategy at Lions Clubs International.

February 1, 2020 – Club presidents of international winners will be notified on or before this date.

Participants accept all responsibility for late, lost, misdirected or illegible entries. Entries sent with insufficient postage will be disqualified. Lions Clubs International is not responsible for entries damaged, destroyed or lost during the judging process. Entries cannot be acknowledged or returned. They become property of Lions Clubs International upon receipt. Essays (partial or in their entirety) cannot be used without written permission from Lions Clubs International.

In consideration for the opportunity to enter the Essay Contest, participants agree to allow Lions Clubs International to use their names and photographs for promotional and publicity purposes. An international grand prize winner is not eligible to receive subsequent prizes in future Lions International Essay Contests sponsored by Lions Clubs International. By entering, participants agree to be bound by these rules and the decisions of the judges and Lions Clubs International.


