

Additionally, your club is encouraged to donate to the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation. This Foundation supports several impactful initiatives, including the Lions Gift of Sight, Lions Children's Eye Clinic, Lions Eye Surgery Center, and programs focused on macular degeneration. Your contributions will help save and restore the sight of individuals of all ages.

The Youth Camps & Exchange Project needs your support. Thirty-one international students are excited about the opportunity to visit Minnesota this summer. They are seeking host families for a three-week stay from July 1–24, followed by participation in Camp Spicer from July 25–August 2. ### **Hello Lions All!**

Can you believe it is already June? Time is flying by as I wrap up the first year in my journey to become Governor of 5M7. I've learned so much and still have so much to experience. I would like to start with a shout out to my club, Centerville Lions.



This month they worked on two important service projects. They started by doing a vision screening at a local daycare, which is a new event for us. I would like to thank Lions Deb Johnson and Beth Holmquist for taking the time to come and get the club trained on how to use the vision scanners. Their advice and leadership were so helpful.

The Centerville Lions also attended our local Senior Expo to help collect glasses, hearing aids and telephones. Every little bit we do is helping to change others lives. I am proud to be a Centerville Lion.

On Saturday, May 17<sup>th</sup>, I attended an open house for Can Do Canines. What a great experience. Since 1989, Can Do Canines has placed over 700 specially trained dogs—**free of charge**—with individuals challenged by hearing loss, mobility issues, seizure disorders and more. The facility is such a welcoming place, not only for visitors but for all the dogs they are currently training to be of service to others. The facility has a small apartment set up for people who are just meeting their new partners, and it helps train the dogs on how they can be of service in the home. It was fun because they have two cats who also live there to help the dogs adjust to sharing a living space. They have several opportunities for volunteering if



you are interested. How can you help? I recommend that you invite one of the speakers from Can Do Canines to bring out a dog and speak to your club. Clubs can donate, volunteer to be a puppy raiser and promote awareness through community events and newsletters. These dogs are more than companions—they are lifelines. Together, through dedicated service, we can help Can Do Canines change lives—one dog, one person, one partnership at a time.


In the most recent quarter, the following Clubs are recipients:

### Greetings and thank you MD5M Lions,

First, on behalf of the TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation, I'd like to thank all the MD5M Lions for their generous contributions to the TSCF. As you may know, "The mission of the TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation is to empower MD5M Lions clubs to provide greater service by boosting their ability to complete community projects with matching grants."

We're very proud of the first set of Grants we were able to award during our first year of matching Grants. They were:

You can host even if you work full time


They bring their own spending money


