

Editor's Note: My apologies for the pictures which need to be sent to me in jpeg format rather than pdf file. I hope you get the drift of what wonderful work was done on this accessible rope course.

The Lions of 5M7 have been actively involved with supporting various projects at Camp Friendship in Annandale MN. Back in 2015, a request was made to LCIF for \$100,000 to help fund an accessible ropes course at Camp Courage.

The new accessible Team Quest ropes course would enable campers with physical disabilities to experience a high ropes course; special one-of-a kind accommodations enable them to independently direct their experience, selecting and approaching elements completely on their own. This makes it a unique, one-of-a-kind ropes course.

With these courses, campers used their existing arm and leg strength, but required significant assistance of staff who pulled them up to the climbing wall via a rope pulley system. Campers were only offered this opportunity through staff actions. With the addition of the ramp, campers would now be able to experience the ropes course with limited staff assistance.

It was anticipated that 350 to 400 individuals with physical

disabilities, each of them would have an opportunity to climb on the new course. This LCIF funded project would make available the first and only wheelchair accessible high ropes course and zip-line in the United States.

So, in the fall of 2018 PDG Terry Wold hosted a grand opening for the cabinet and all Lions to see the accessible rope course. Please consider making a donation to LCIF**

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

Becky decided to write "Super Kena" when Kena was a toddler. She searched the internet to find a book about a child with hearing aids but they were hard to find. Most of the books had animals with hearing aids in them. So, she decided to write her own

book for Kena and that's how Super Kena – A Girl Made Fierce with Hearing Aids came about! It's meant to empower children like Kena but also other different-abled children who get teased and only want to fit in. The book touches on children with glasses, diabetes, who stutter, who have peanut allergies, with asthma and who are in wheelchairs. Together, they use their super powers to make a difference in the world by spreading understanding and acceptance one classroom at a time.

LITPC YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION



The Lions International Trading Pin Club (LITPC) has announced for the 2020 - 2021 school year that there will be 3 US \$2,500 scholarships awarded. Graduating Leos OR graduating sons/ daughters, grandsons/granddaughters of Lions or Lioness are eligible to apply for the LITPC Youth Scholarship. The LITPC goal is to help our future leaders and give students a financial helping hand. This program started in 2012. Recipients have been from Georgia, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota (2), New York (2), Ohio (3), Oklahoma (2), Pennsylvania (2) and Virginia (3). The 2021 recipients will be announced at the LITPC Pin Traders Annual Breakfast in June, 2021. Selection of the scholarship recipients will be based on academic achievement, an essay stating the student's goals, a statement of reason(s) for applying and an overview of work, community and school service, and letters of recommendation.

The current forms for the scholarships are available on line at www.litpc.org In the right column, click on LITPC Scholarship Information. Then click on Scholarship Application Form. Please follow the instructions, fill out ALL the forms neatly and correctly which includes the 4 essay questions (in 350 words or less) and the question about scholarships that you have been offered along with submitting a certified copy of your high school transcript including activities. Plus you also need to attach recommendations from 2 persons (i.e. teacher, coach, clergy, employer, etc.) AND attach a recommendation letter from a Lions Club member indicating the name of the Club and state/ province and country in which the Club is located. 


UPCOMING EVENTS

Thank you for your interest in participating in the Tinnitus Research Study with the Otology research team at the University of Minnesota!

This is a research study to examine how tinnitus or 'ringing in the ears' affects brain signals, and how these brain signals can be used to help researchers develop better tools to diagnose people with tinnitus.
