We are looking for Lions from your district to attend the 2021 MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute! Lions that are selected as participants in the Institute must be in good standing in a Lions Club and may not be a 1st Vice District Governor, District Governor, Past District Governor, International Director, or Past International Director. The \$150 fee for the Leadership Institute includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs and additional meals are not included. However, a \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program. Participants MUST be available to attend ALL sessions beginning on Thursday evening and ending Sunday afternoon.

Each district has the opportunity to send six (6) participants; however, if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions. The Institute will have a maximum of 72 participants.

Applications are available from your District Governor or on the MD5M Website and are due (without fees) by August <u>31, 2021.</u> Your District Governor will then make the final participant selection. Institute graduates from your district will tell you that the Regional Lions Leadership Institute is beneficial for you in every facet of your life and not just in your role as a Lion. I

### Lions Macular Degeneration Center

Age-related macular degeneration is the leading cause of vision loss in Americans 60 and older. A disease that causes damage to the macula (the part of the retina responsible for central vision) age-related macular degeneration (AMD) erodes our ability to recognize faces, read, view a painting, or perform intricate tasks. Over 3 million people in the United States will have AMD by the year 2021.

The Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation and the University of Minnesota are changing the outlook for those who suffer from macular degeneration. Together, they established the Minnesota Lions Macular Degeneration Research and Rehabilitation Center (the MAC) and the Lions Advanced Retinal Imaging Center. The MAC is a collaboration of people, organizations, and resources working to find new treatments and a cure for macular degeneration.

#### **Retina Clinic**

University of Minnesota ophthalmologists who specialize in vitreoretinal conditions are dedicated to examining and aggressively treating patients with macular degeneration.

#### Visual Rehabilitation Center

This state-of-the-art low-vision center uses advanced technology and education to help people remain independent in the home, school, workplace, and community. Visual rehabilitation specialists teach people with low vision they still have.

#### Macular Degeneration Research

Laboratories dedicated to macular degeneration and retinal research are housed in the Lions Research Building. Scientists study many aspects of retinal disease, including the biology of aging. They collaborate with colleagues from other University departments, as well as from around the country. Research is critical to finding new medical options to treat and cure macular degeneration.


### LIONS VOICE CLINIC



### Greetings fellow Lions.

Have you heard the news? The State Fair is back. KARE 11 has asked KidSight to participate in their Health Fair Building again this year. The Health Fair focus this

year will be on screening, with a limited number of vendors. Proposed one way traffic and bigger spaces will allow for more distancing. We would love to have you volunteer your time at the fair joining the fun at the KidSight screening booth!

5M7 is responsible for **Monday**, **August 30 and Tuesday**, **August 31.** Shifts are approximately 3.5 hours with a cross over between shifts. The job descriptions and shift expectations are as follows:

<u>Vision Screener:</u> (2 positions) This Lion will be responsible for doing the vision screening using either of our screening systems, the Welch Allyn SPOT or the PlusOptix.

<u>Greeter:</u> (2 positions) This Lion will be responsible for standing in front of the booth and greeting people with children asking them if they would like to have their children's vision checked. They will carry a clip board with the consent forms and will instruct the parent or guardian in the correct manner to complete the form. They will check the form for legibility and completeness. They will hold the family in the outside area until a vision screener Lion is ready for them. They will then pass the paperwork and the family to the escort Lion. This position requires standing for long periods of time, approaching people and explaining the vision screening program.

**Escort:** (2 positions) The Escort Lion will receive the consent form from the Greeter. They will bring the family or child to the vision screening position. Once the screening is complete, they will hand the appropriate form to the parent along with the screening explanation sheet.

If the result is a non-refer, they will hand the non-refer form to the parent and thank them for having their child's eyesight screened. They will then place the consent form in the appropriate box. They will then proceed to the next waiting family.

If the result is a refer, they will have the parent complete the required items on the consent form. They will hand the parent the refer letter, the printout of the screening results and the explanation of screening form. They will then file the consent form in the appropriate box. They will then proceed to the next waiting family. This position is suited to a Lion who enjoys doing paperwork and is detail and process oriented. This position also requires standing for long periods of time.

Each volunteer will receive fair admission tickets with mileage reimbursement. This link will take you to the Sign Up Genius app where you may select your volunteer shift or shifts .https://

# LIONS!



This is the first call for the 2022 5m7 Mid-winter con-

vention. The dates are January 7 through January 9, 2022. The location will be the NW Marriott in Brooklyn Park, 7025 Northland Blvd. That's at the corner of 694 and Boone Avenue N. The cost for the suites will be \$119 plus tax.

The committee is still working on details but this will give you a good idea of what and when things are going to happen.

The district's commitment to the Marriott is \$10,000. That revenue will be generated by charging everyone a registration fee. That registration fee has been added to the cost of meals.

Speaking of costs, here is an example of what we have to pay for dinner on Saturday night with a New York Strip on the menu. The Marriott is charging \$47. In addition to that there is a 24% service and gratuity charge added to the \$47. Once that has been added there is a state tax of 7.525% added to the total for a total cost of the meal of \$62.66. The convention has to charge that cost, to each person, having dinner on Saturday night. We'll have more cost information out when the expenses have been finalized.

### <u>Friday</u>

Programming will begin on Friday afternoon with a gambling seminar. Lion Shawn Donahue will have more information out about that seminar later this year. There will be a cabinet meeting late that afternoon. This will be followed by a reception for the International Director.

### Saturday

There will be several seminars in the morning. The convention will convene about 11:30 am. This will be followed by lunch, the memorial service, a business meeting and a Leo's speech contest. There will be a banquet. The day will end with entertainment and a cash bar.

### <u>Sunday</u>

Brunch with an address by the International Director.

There will be much more information coming out as we get closer to the convention. This is just a heads-up for lions to begin to plan for this event.
