

The location will be the NW Marriott in Brooklyn Park, 7025 Northland Blvd. All of the convention details will be out in an invitation the first week in October. Here are some of the details:

FIRST, The dates are set for January 7 through January 9, 2022. There will be a cabinet meeting on Friday January 7th. The Zone chairs should expect to provide the International Director a short update on your respective zones. The other cabinet officers will be able to give the Director an update of their respective committees at the business meeting Saturday afternoon. Following the cabinet meeting there will be a reception for the cabinet and club presidents. Nothing else is planned for Friday evening.

SECOND, Saturday morning will feature 3 or 4 presentations. The last presentation will be an open discussion with our International Director. Immediately following the directors, the convention will convene. We will have a service of remembrance and business meeting. For the first time there will be a Leo's Speech Contest. There are three categories; grades 7 and 8, grades 9 and 10, and grades 11 and 12. There will be cash awards for each category. The winner of grades 11 and 12 will be offered a youth exchange scholarship of \$1k or a \$250 gift card. Following the banquet we will be entertained by Bryce Hegge. THIRD, Sunday morning we'll hear from our International Director. Our International Director is Lion Dianne Pitts from South Carolina.

FOURTH, there will be tables available from the convention committee for the Foundations. We have a limited number of tables available for the convention as part of our overall costs therefore, anyone wanting a table will have to rent a skirted table from the Marriott at the cost of \$30.

FIFTH, clubs will be asked to donated a door prize. Door prizes will be handed out during each meal. The Leo's will be tail-twisting at the noon luncheon. There will be a link for hotel reservations available later this fall. Cost for a standard room, which is a suite, will be \$119 +tax.




