One of the issues surrounding our membership numbers has always been our lack of visibility in the



> The wheel chair is provided on a permanent loan basis subsequent to the signing of an agreement, with LIONS retaining ownership and providing inspections and maintance.

> When the individual no longer has use for the wheel chair it is returned to the participating LIONS club to

be repaired as required and made available for others in need.

To date this can tab account has partially funded the purchase of three wheel chairs in three communities, with the participating Lions Club funding the balance required.

THE ROYAL ORDER OF LIONS - OUR BEGINNING

In all the material our Lions Information Committee has circulated over the past couple of years, we have stressed that our Lions organization began in 1917. While that is technically correct, there's another side to the story, and that's the subject of this meeting's Lions Information circular. We hope it will be of interest to all our members, and particularly those who have joined our ranks in the past couple of years.

We all know that our Founder, Melvin Jones, was a member of the Business Circle of Chicago, one of many allmale organizations that sprang up in – the late 1800's and the early part of $\frac{5}{2}$ the 1900's. The primary purpose and g philosophy of those groups was to ∃ meet people involved in other occumeet people involved in other occu- gations and professions, and to share a ideas and concepts about how they \$\frac{1}{2}\$ could help each other to succeed. The concept of "service" - helping 5 the less fortunate and contributing 3 to a better community – without $\frac{2}{6}$ personal reward – was not as yet a $\frac{2}{6}$ reason for membership in those orga- 3 nizations.

risen to the office of Secretary, he ⁷ er held by 2nd VDG Bob Hunter) spoke of "the marvelous opportunity for businessmen to work together for the betterment of the community and to serve others". He began to spread this concept of "service without personal reward" to other similar organizations.

One such organization was the "Royal Order of Lions", headquartered in the State of Indiana, USA. History tells us that the Royal Order of Lions was organized in 1901, and over the next few years had grown to have a membership of 650 men from 105 diverse professional categories: syndicated columnists, businessmen, painters, newsboys, journalists, surgeons, lawyers, piano sellers, car re-
