

5-6-2012 Del Sol Solana Beach Lions Club, Cinco de Mayo Health Event, La Colonia Park, 715 Valley Ave, Solana Beach, 92075

Approximately 43 people in this local community event were serviced with Blood Pressure Checking, Diabetes Screening, and Glaucoma Testing services.

Blood Pressure Checks for Hypertension recorded the following results (Optimal Reading is considered Systolic less than 120 and Diastolic of less than 80) using portable OMRON and Microlife Blood Pressure Monitors: 1 case of a Low-Normal Reading (e.g., Systolic 105 / Diastolic 65); 8 cases of High-Normal Readings (e.g., Systolic 130-137 // Diastolic 55-84); 4 cases of Stage-1 Mild Hypertension (e.g., Systolic 142-159 // Diastolic 82-96) were recorded [The one patient with a BP reading of 159/94 is also currently taking BP meds for her Hypertension problem]; and 2 cases of Stage-2 Moderate Hypertension (e.g., Systolic 162-165 // Diastolic 96-99) [The one patient with a BP reading of 162/96 had a high BP reading even though she is currently taking BP meds]; and there no cases of Stage-3 Severe Hypertension noted All patients were advised of the need for dietary changes and were also told to make BP testing a routine effort, whenever possible.

Blood-Sugar Glucose Tests for Diabetes or Diabetic symptoms recorded the following results (Optimal Readings are 70 - 120 Fasting for at least 90 minutes prior to testing or 70 - 170 non-fasting) using TRUEtrack Blood Glucose Meters and Test Strips: a total of three cases of elevated Diabetic readings were observed with readings of 169, 182, and 244. All three were non-fasting readings; the patient with a 169 reading is currently on diabetic meds as is the patient with a 244 reading. The patient with a 169 reading was retested after about 90 minutes and the second reading came out to be 155. The patient with an initial reading of 244 was also retested after a while and the second reading came out to be 206. There were also two more patients with readings of 150 and 158 but these may have been glucose spikes because we were not certain if they were both fasting or non-fasting before the readings were taken. All of these patients were actually counseled on dietary changes, exercise and the need for follow-up with a physician.

There was one patient with a normal BP reading of 114/81 and Blood Sugar reading of 131 that has three sisters living in Europe who are all diabetics.

Glaucoma Screenings were performed by Lion Larry Hudson and assisted by Alysa Mena using a Frequency Doubling Technology (FDT) unit. Only 12 people of the 43 registered sign-ups requested a Glaucoma Screening. Of those 3 people are beginning to show signs of Glaucoma and therefore categorized as "Suspect" cases because of their "bad" test reports; a fourth case was determined to also be a "Suspect" case who actually is aware of having glaucoma symptoms but doesn't have the means to obtain the available medication. All 4 cases were provided referrals to the La Maesta Community Health Center, 4060 Fairmount Avenue, San Diego, 92105 to obtain the necessary follow-up care/treatment.

This report reflects an average sampling of health problems for such a small demographic Hispanic community. The relatively small sampling (referring to the 43 patients tested) is somewhat smaller for the same health screening event conducted in 2011 at the La Colonia Park. There appears to have been sufficient publicity for this event but the attendance is somewhat disappointing. However, the demographic area could suggest the need to conduct more health screenings in this area beyond the current schedule of an annual event.

The health fair provided Blood pressure and Diabetes screening and health related information to 24 registered attendees. Of those 24 attendees, Blood pressure were classified into categories: 15 -normal (120 and 180); 5 Prehypertension (120-139 or 80-89); 4 hypertension, stage1 (140-159 or 90-99); Blood Pressure Goals: 120/180).

On Diabetes screening, 20 cases of diabetes are normal, 1 pre-diabetic

The health fair provided Blood pressure to 34 registered attendees. Of those 34 attendees, Blood pressure were classified into categories: 18 -normal (<120 and <80); 8 Prehypertension (120-139 or 80-89); 5 hypertension, stage 2 (>160 or >100). Suggested to follow up with their doctors, exercise, stop smoking, reduce weight, sufficient rest, don't over sleep, low salt and low protein, Blood Pressure Goals: <120/<80).
