Approximately 71 people in this local community event were serviced with Blood Pressure Checks and Blood-Sugar Glucose Readings.

Blood Pressure Checks for Hypertension recorded the following results (Optimal Reading is considered Systolic less than 120 and Diastolic of less than 80): 1 case of Low BP (Hypotension) with a reading of 84/58; 4 cases of Low Normal Readings (e.g., Systolic 94-99 // Diastolic 63-69); 10 cases of High Normal Readings (e.g., Systolic 133-140 // Diastolic 69-93) [1 patient is currently taking BP meds]; 5 cases of Stage-1 Mild Hypertension (e.g., Systolic 141-154 // Diastolic 74-96) were recorded; and 1 case of Stage-2 Moderate Hypertension (e.g., Systolic 163 // Diastolic 104). All patients were advised of the need for dietary changes and were also told to make BP testing a routine effort, whenever possible.

Blood-Sugar Glucose Tests for Diabetes or Diabetic symptoms recorded the following results (Optimal Readings are 70 - 120 Fasting for at least 90 minutes prior to testing or 70 - 170 non-fasting): a total of seven (7) cases of elevated Diabetic readings (e.g., 162, 169 [this patient is currently on oral meds], 170 [this patient is also on Insulin], 184 [this patient is currently on oral meds], 189 [this patient is currently on oral meds], 195 [this patient is currently on oral meds], 230 [this patient is taking oral meds and was referred to La Maestra Health Center for follow-up consultation and care]). All of these patients were identified as non-fasting patients.

An information station was also set up to provide information in English and Spanish on many health related subjects, including Blood Pressure and Diabetes. A substantial number of information packets, documents, and flyers were distributed in order to help educate the attendees to this health event how to better take charge of their physical well being.

55 employees and their families were serviced with Blood Pressure Checks and Blood-Sugar Glucose Readings.

Blood Pressure Checks for Hypertension recorded the following results (Optimal Reading is considered Systolic less than 120 and Diastolic of less than 80) 32 patients Normal (range 120/80); 10 Prehypertension (120-139 or 80-89); 5 patients StageI, Hypertension (140-159 or 90-99); 1 patient Stage2 Hypertention (> 160 or >100). All patients who has concern were given verbal advice such as proper diet, exercise. Also recommend to see physician even when they're on medication. Provided a blood pressure chart which contains foods to avoid and how to lower blood pressure information.

Blood-Sugar Glucose Tests for Diabetes. (Optimal Readings are 70 - 120 Fasting for at least 90 minutes prior to testing or 70 - 170 non-fasting). 34 normal reading; 7 patients are prediabetic and 1 diabetic.
