Winners of all games will receive a designer purse. There will be quickies and pull tabs.



New Tools for Disaster Assistance

When natural disasters strike, Lions are among the first to offer help. LCIF offers a variety of grant options to support various stages of disaster relief operations and these are detailed at https://www.lionsclubs.org/en/start-our-approach/grant-types/disaster-grants. The Emergency Preparedness and Disaster Assistance Committee is excited to announce two additional tools for Indiana Lions to help those impacted by a disaster to complement what is available through the LCIF. Earlier this year, the Indiana Lions Foundation announced the creation of disaster assistance grants. These grants, not to exceed \$1,000, are for Districts impacted by a natural disaster that has affected at least 100 people. Grant applications must be made by the District Governor of the affected area within 30 days of the occurrence with funds spent within 30 days of receipt of funds and may be used to help meet immediate relief needs such as food, water, clothing and medical supplies. The second new tool is the Lions of Indiana being admitted to a statewide disaster assistance consortium called Indiana Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (IVOAD.) The Indiana VOAD consists of approximately forty not-forprofit organizations committed to providing disaster assistance. Being a part of this consortium, which meets monthly, will allow us to coordinate our disaster assistance efforts in a focused way and help us avoid duplicating what other volunteer organizations may be providing. The VOAD has asked Lions to consider assisting in the area of case management. This would involve assisting victims of disasters who have suffered property loss to put their lives back together by assisting with filing insurance claims, applying for disaster loans, arranging for repairs to their property and other assistance as may be needed. If this kind of people-helping opportunity appeals to you, we are scheduling a 90 minute online webinar to provide an overview of what his commitment would be. There is no obligation beyond this webinar as individual Lions can decide if this opportunity is something they want to pursue or not. 

MD Positions open for candidates:

STATE COMPTROLLER

Term: 2 years, starting on July 15, 2023, thru July 14, 1025. (State Constitution, Article IV, Section 4)

Each District shall conduct an investigation to determine if it has a qualified candidate for State Comptroller. One (1) candidate from each District can be submitted. Election for that candidate will follow District election format. The candidate shall furnish a statement in writing showing that such candidate is willing to be nominated, will serve if elected. Each such written statement shall be submitted by the District Governor to the State Council Chairperson with a copy to the State Nominations and Elections Committee Chairperson at least ten (10) days before the opening of the State Convention.

INDIANA INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION COMMITTEE

Term: 3 years, starting after the International Convention, 2023 thru 2025. (State Constitution Article IV, Section 6)

Qualifications: A PDG from Districts: C, D, E, F or G, ONLY.

Elected members of the Indiana International Convention Committee shall be elect at the State Convention from among candidates nominated at their District Convention, shall follow the procedure set forth in the By-Laws of that district. Such nominations shall be submitted by the District Governor to the State Council Chairman with a copy to the State Nominations and Election Chairman at least thirty (30) days before the opening of the State Convention.

If no nominations are received on time, nominations will be taken from the floor at a State Convention business meeting.
