#### What is a Lion!

Lions of 25D,

As I shared last July, my theme for this year has been: **What is a Lion?** Lions are many things and my newsletter articles and club visits have highlighted some of the many answers. My hope has been that when you are asked that question, you will be armed with your answer and ready to share the great things that Lions are.

As I wrap up my year serving as your district governor, the answer is: **Someone surrounded by a great team.** As I've shared in my club visits, we all have many opportunities to volunteer in our

all have many opportunities to volunteer in our communities. We join our Lions Clubs because we want to be part of a likeminded group who work together to do more than we can do alone. This is true in our clubs and in our district leadership. I have been surrounded by a great **team** and together we have accomplished even more than the goals we set in spring 2023.

Our first goal is service, and our goal was to have at least 85% of clubs report service. Lions Clubs International (LCI) asks that we report service so that we can show the world how and where 'We Serve.' Due to the extra efforts by Global Service Chair **Anita Hines**, I am thrilled to share that 100% of our clubs have had service reported this year. As of this writing, District 25D has reported 669 service activities serving 85,874 people since July 1, 2023, and I suspect that's a low count.

Our second goal is membership, and our goal was to have one new club and have each club add at least one new member. Under the leadership of Global Membership and Extension Chair **Jeff Kozicki**, we have restarted the Muncie Lions Club and are 75% of the way to starting the Gas City Lions Club. More importantly, 24 of our 35 clubs have added at least one new member. As a district, we are plus 32 in membership for the year. We know that many clubs clean their rosters in June before the invoices come on July 1, but I am confident we will finish this year with positive growth.

Our third goal is leadership, where our goal was train 83% of our zone chairs and 25% of our club officers. Our Global Leadership Chair **IPCC Scott Smith** achieved the zone chair goal and was close on club officer training last summer. If you are a club officer who has completed Lions online training, let us know so we can get you recorded. We had a great club officer training in Matthews to get next year's officers started and you can go on the Lions Portal to do additional training at your convenience.

The service we provide strengthens our communities and combats the epidemic of loneliness for our members and our neighbors. #### **Cyber Clean-up for Security**



So, just how many online accounts do you have?

How many of them use your cell phone for two-factor authentication?

How many accounts use your email as the logon id OR use your email for two-factor authentication OR account recovery? Chances are it is way more than you think.

Because I am cancelling an internet phone and will have a new cell phone number in the near future, I thought I would start logging on to all of my accounts, cleaning them up, and setting them straight in anticipation. As of this article, I have spent several hours, verified 58 accounts and alphabetically I am ONLY UP TO K! There is a similar number remaining.

Half way through this process, I have some thoughts for you.

- Use a password manager. Having passwords securely locked into a manager will make it easier next time to move through accounts when changes are necessary. I use LastPass, but there are several other good ones out there.
- Have a trusted backup person with whom you can share your password manager master password. Otherwise, if you expire unexpectedly your family will spend countless hours trying to get into your accounts or getting them terminated.
- **Setup two-factor authentication** when available. If not offered when logging on, go to your account's settings.
- **Delete unused accounts.** Fewer accounts, less headaches. 'Nuf said.

There are services that will help you delete old online accounts and subscriptions. Experian has one of the newest services. Just search online with keywords *cancelling unwanted subscriptions* to find articles and services.

What are you waiting for? Get started when you don't have to so it's not panic time when you do. Send me an email if you have questions.

#### **Musical Notes—Lion George Smith**

A major prayer and wish that a young man I dreamed to be know every-

Think back to both Lion Jeff and DG Julia's teamwork as they together applied their knowledge to make OUR year stand out. To add and thrust new ideas into our minds and local activities of our individual clubs. Did we make them proud? Did our club get new members through inviting a friend to a Lions meeting? Have we had an information meeting telling the story of Lionism? 
