Committed to a Solution

Nearly one in nine people around the world suffers from chronic undernourishment.

Lions are striving to change this by improving food security and access to healthy foods options in their communities.

“We want to make sure there is not one day where the children sleep with hunger and not one day where children go to school with an empty stomach,” says Past District Governor Ruth Chua, president of the Manila Amity Lions Club in the Philippines.

Knowing that a single meal wouldn't make a lasting impact on the lives of children, the Amity Lions offer a small incentive to children who gain the most weight. With the assistance of an LCIF grant, Lions have been helping these children grow stronger, avoid illness and infection, and regularly attend school.

The Manila Amity Lions were joined by the Tacloban City Lions who extended the feeding project to a school in Tacloban City. Devastated in 2013 by Super Typhoon Yolanda, many children were left with no family income as their fisherman parents were forced to relocate. Chua also hopes to help these parents rebuild their lives.

“We cannot feed their children forever. We want their parents to also do their share,” says Chua, “But right now we want to save the children.”

These efforts extend worldwide.

LCIF and World Diabetes Foundation: Mobile Units Drive Increased Access and Care

The Fight Against Diabetes

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) and World Diabetes Foundation (WDF) are collaborating to fight against diabetes, a growing epidemic worldwide. The project, “Promote Early Prevention and Better Management of Diabetes Complications,” is a comprehensive diabetes and diabetic retinopathy care project reaching six regions in the



In India, Lions are providing free lunches to 19,000 children across the country every day. In District 321 A2, US\$10,400 in free grain was distributed across the nation to needy people. Roughly US\$1 feeds three people.

In East Africa, the Kenyan Lions of District 411 A team up with Lions in Sweden to provide supplies for famine victims. In Lebanon, Lions ran a charity restaurant that fed thousands. In Australia, District 201 V5's Hunger Portfolio brings Lions and the community together assembling food hampers for families in need.

In the U.S., Illinois Lions support Feed My Starving Children, a nonprofit that produces nutritionally complete meals specifically formulated for malnourished children in the poorest areas of the world.

Every community has its own way to contribute.

“Who knows? One of the children Lions help could be the future leader of this country,” says Chua. “If we can provide better health and better education, they could free themselves from the poverty they are in now. They could have a better life.”

southeastern European country of Georgia. The 2.5-year effort is co-funded by WDF and LCIF, as well as by local in-kind supporters. LCIF and WDF are both proudly contributing US\$215,000 toward the project.

Free Screenings Play Significant Role

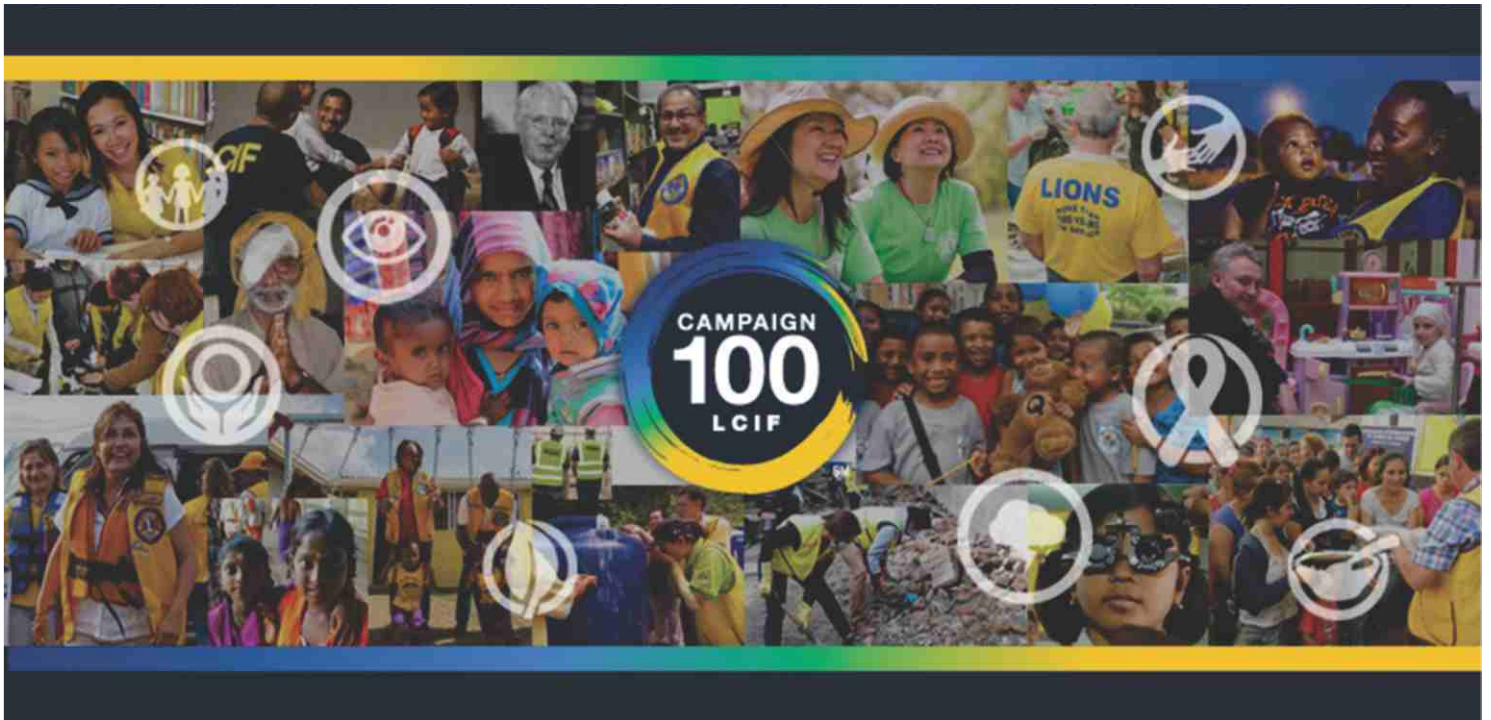
With help from nearby Lions and local partners, the project will establish centers for diagnosis and treatment of diabetes and diabetic retinopathy, and provide eye screenings and diabetic foot care. A mobile diabetes unit will reach remote areas of Georgia. Screenings at these centers will provide services at no cost, and treatment of diabetes complications will be of no cost for socially vulnerable population groups.

Partnering Up for Prevention

“WDF creates global and local partnerships that assist people with diabetes and those at risk for the disease,” says Leif Fenger Jensen, WDF managing director. “Our goal is to enhance access to care and prevent

complications from diabetes, especially among the most vulnerable and poor populations.

“Our partnership with LCIF is a prime example of how two foundations with a global outreach can join forces and resources. Together, we are supporting a locally owned project in Georgia that is enhancing diabetes care and reducing the burden of diabetic retinopathy as a complication of diabetes.”
