Lion's Project... The Orphanage of Lapiai/Lithuania

- The building is more than 100 years old.
- The conditions are very poor.
- Normal heating of the living space and bedrooms is not possible.

The Orphanage and Dormitory



3 showers for 43 girls and boys



- There are only two toilets and 3 showers for currently 43 children, over an area of about 4 square meters. (43 square feet.)
- The ceiling looks as though it will fall down any moment.
- 5NW has decided to send monetary gifts so they can purchase whatever they decide is their greatest need.
- Presently, there are 43 children living at the orphanage. 18 have the opportunity to stay
 with their parents on the weekends. These are monitored visits because the parents are
 at risk. The remaining children are 7-17 years old and some have lived at the orphanage
 for 7 years.

Lions Club of KweKwe, Zimbabwe

Lion's Project ... The Chimwaoga Primary School

- Zimbabwe is about the size of Montana and has a population of 14.5 million people.
- Lions Clubs International opened its doors in Zimbabwe on September 21st, 1959.
- The Chimwaoga Primary School is a school for children of the farming community east of KweKwe. They have an enrollment of 450 children grade 0 to grade 7.
- The children need help with books, writing materials, clothing and shoes.
- The school also needs furniture for the children and teachers. The kids often use chairs as desks and kneel on the floor.
- 5NW has decided to send monetary gifts so they can purchase whatever they decide is their greatest need.
