Campaign SightFirst II gets organized

Fifteen years ago the original Campaign SightFirst was conducted with such great success that Lions Clubs International decided to do another campaign. It's called CAMPAIGN SIGHTFIRST II, has PIP Tae Sup Lee as its worldwide chairperson, has a goal of US\$200,000,000 and is set up to run for three years.

YEAR ONE (2005-06): Planning, organization and preparation. Lead gifts and corporate gifts are requested. Model Clubs are recruited and begin fund-raising.

YEAR TWO (2006-07): Clubs set goals and begin fund-raising activities. Lead gifts and Model Club activities continue.

YEAR THREE (2007-08): Clubs complete fund-raising. Lead Gift effort concludes. All reporting is completed. Success is celebrated at Bangkok International Convention!

CAMPAIGN SIGHTFIRST II is organized worldwide according to LCI Constitutional Areas. The United States, Bermuda and the Bahamas comprise Constitutional Area I. Minnesota, Iowa, Nebraska, South Dakota and North Dakota are in Constitutional Area I (West) which is designated as National/Multi-National Area I-7 with PID Ross Thorfinnson of Minnesota as its coordinator.

National/Multi-national Area I-7 is broken down further with North Dakota and South Dakota making up Sector I-7-D, of which I am sector coordinator.

Sector I-7-D (ND & SD) is divided by Lions districts with each having a district coordinator.

Districts are broken down into club groupings with no more than eight clubs in a group similar to and in some cases exactly like our current zones. Each group has a group coordinator.

The meeting was called to order at 1:16PM Oct 28, 2005 by Pres Helegesen. He welcomed the Board Members and guests.

The secretary's minutes were approved as printed.

The Treasurer's report is for all of last year. The books have been audited and the taxes filed. Motion to accept by Lion Froemming and a 2nd by DG Johnson. We currently have \$85,518.55, but \$16,883.is designated funds. We have \$56,053.05 in CD's.

Pres. Helegesen thanked PDG Sorenson for his past service and his faithful work with the Foundation. PDG Sorenson responded with thanked the past members for their help and commented positively on how the corpus has grown over the past few years.

OLD BUSINESS:

Pres. Helegesen reminded us that we still have raffle tickets left to sell for the vest with all the pins on it that PDG Voegele has donated as a fund-raiser. The drawing will be on Sunday morning at the state meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Newspaper: The paper is doing well and PDG Helegesen says he has had no complaints. Returned postage costs have improved. VGD Tweed asked that the other DG's and VDG's from the MultiDistrict receive the paper. Motion by DG Whitney and PDG Sayler, Motion Carried. VDG Tweed will take care of getting the names and addresses to the paper. It was noted that the DG's are getting reimbursed at a higher rate than before for the paper. They each receive \$600 per year now instead of \$300. The subscription rate for the newspaper is \$5/year for US delivery and \$10/year for Canadian delivery for folks who are not ND Lions.

White Cane Day: PDG Voegele has all the White Cane day supplies with him and the Foundation will have a table where clubs can pick them up. Foundation members are needed to help staff the table during convention. We will also be selling raffle tickets for the pin filled vest at the booth.

Vision USA – DG Whitney gave the report. A letter went out from the ND Optometry Association to all the clubs. He is for a resolution for \$2/Lions member from all the Lions of ND. This is now a 12-month program and has been working much better the

ByLaws – DG Marian Johnson states that that changes to the bylaws have been published in the ND Lion and sent to all the clubs statewide. The proposed changes will be voted upon at the State meeting.

Lions In Action – President Helgesen stated that he had appointed PDG Grunett to chair this committee. PDG Grunett's says that we have accomplished quite a bit this year. We have a new site manager for the concession stand at the Ralph and we are making progress. He has 6 committees set up for this project and several meetings have been held. Our menu has changed somewhat and we are still experimenting. We are looking for Lion club members to volunteer.

NEW BUSINESS:

Future meetings will be held the same day of the eye bank meetings.

PDG Helegesen shared a fund raising project that Schwann's sponsors.

Our next meeting will be in January, date to be announced.

No other business.

Meeting was adjourned.



I would really like to see more participation in this fine program than we have seen up to now. Lion Lisa will be getting information to the ND LION and to the clubs of 5NC as to how we can promote this program in our local schools. This program is not costly!

A kit is only \$7.95, and it includes all of the information you will need to sponsor a contest. Watch for Lion Lisa's information, or check on the Lions International Web site, www.lionsclubs.org to get the latest details. (click on "Other Programs", and then "Peace Poster Contest"). The Web site currently shows a number of last year's winning posters. I have seen these posters in person at several International Conventions, and I cannot look at them without tears welling up in my eyes. It is so touching to see the artwork of these talented 11- to 13-year-olds and to read their quotes of what peace means to them.

Another area of concern is gaining members. Wait, you say, that's not new! But, as you can see from Membership Chairman Chris Helgesen's article last month, there is a new wrinkle. As an incentive, the 5NC Cabinet has authorized a rebate of the induction fee (\$25) for each new member after Dec. 1 - man or woman. However, we can only cover this cost for **the first 25 new members** whose clubs apply to Tim Johnson, the District Treasurer, for the reimbursement. So if you have a prospective member in mind, do not hesitate. In addition, according to an e-mail I received

just after Christmas, the Lions International Board has also approved two "entrance fee" rebates: 1) for spouses of current members, but they must join the same club as the spouse, and 2) for former members who are re-joining. Please make your members, and your treasurers, aware of these possibilities for saving your new member some money, or your club, if they traditionally pay this fee. The International rebates are in force through June 30, 2006. Let's get busy inviting friends, neighbors, and relatives to join us in this great organization!

We are also beginning several new extension efforts. My goal at the beginning of the year was to start a Lions Club in Rollette County, a Campus Lions Club at the University of Mary, and a new Leo Club at Bishop Ryan in Minot. Easy to say, but now we have the work ahead of us! We are just in the beginning stages of all of these efforts. If any of you would like to work with one of these areas, please contact me, and we'll add you to the team. As Woodrow Wilson once said, "I don't just use all the brains I have, but all the brains I can borrow." I need to borrow some brains for these projects—I promise to give them back!


