
On July 27, 2007, the Lions Diabetes Ocular Research Center at the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences will begin its 20th year. The Center was established in 1988 when the North Dakota Lions Foundation presented an initial gift of \$20,000 to the UND School of Medicine. Since that time, through the collective

efforts of the North Dakota Lions Foundation and numerous Lions clubs throughout North Dakota, a total of nearly \$60,000 has been contributed. The Diabetes Ocular Research Center, located in the Department of Anatomy and Cell Biology in the Edwin C. James Medical Research Facility in the UND School of Medicine, is dedicated to investigating the chronic complications of diabetes with particular emphasis on eye and kidney diseases which frequently lead to blindness or renal failure.

Dr. Ed Carlson, professor and chair of the UND Anatomy and Cell Biology Department, has been the director of the Diabetes Ocular Research Center since its inception and continues to lead a team of researchers seeking answers to basic questions about the nature of diabetic eye and kidney disease. Questions include: What kind of structural and biochemical changes occur in these organs that eventually lead to vision loss, kidney damage, and other disorders? What causes the breakdown of certain regulatory processes that are needed to maintain healthy function of these organs? What kinds of chemicals can be used to intervene in the progression of diabetes?

To begin to solve these difficult problems, Dr. Carlson and the

Diabetes Ocular Research Center research team have utilized a number of animal models of diabetes. These include rats that are spontaneously diabetic and mice that have been genetically engineered to express diabetes. The latter studies are done in collaboration with Dr. Paul Epstein, formerly a pharmacology


professor at UND and now a Diabetes Center Director at the University of Louisville. Together these researchers have made excellent progress and have published more than 50 peerreviewed manuscripts describing

their results. They also have made numerous oral and poster presentations at major universities as well as at annual national and international meetings including Experimental Biology and the American Diabetes Association.

Importantly, the Lions of North Dakota continue to be a major player in the progress of the Diabetes Ocular Research Center. Over the years, funding from the Lions has made possible the addition of post-doctoral research workers and the purchase of new equipment as well as basic research supplies. Testament to this outstanding support is found in the "Acknowledgements" section in each of the published articles derived from the Center where Dr. Carlson and his associates are careful to point out that, "This research is supported in part by funds from the North Dakota Lions".

Dr. Carlson expresses his sincere gratitude to all North Dakota Lions for their vision in developing the Lions Diabetes Ocular Research Center and for their support of its work. Moreover, he believes the Center will continue indefinitely and he is constantly

seeking additional support to keep it viable. Currently, the Center research team includes Dr. Carlson, two technicians, a doctoral graduate student and a post-doctoral researcher. The team is dedicated to the belief that uncovering new information at the molecular level will shed new light on the basic mechanisms in the progression of diabetic eye and kidney disease. It is their hope that such information will lead to new and novel therapeuticintervention in these devastating disorders.

To everyone on the Cabinet, thank you.



After May 1st, the fee will be \$70. You also have more chances to win the 24k Gold Buffalo Coin by registering



New club guidelines clarified

Dear Governors/Vice Governors,

During the March 2007 board of directors meeting, the members and committees of the board, as well as the international officers discussed several important topics. We wish to call your attention to some of these important matters as follows:

- A. New Board Decisions
- Discontinuation of transitional designation
- C. The term "transitional" is replaced with "established districts below 35/1,250 over two years."
- D. Former transitional districts can elect their governors now.
- E. In districts below 35/1,250 over two years, the transportation expenses for the governor's spouse to attend the District Governor-elect Seminar and International Convention will be reimbursed if the membership in the district shows a net gain of one or more members, at the end of the governor's term. Membership loss by deaths and transfers must be replaced in order to have a net gain.
- F. Also, the number of members in status quo clubs cannot be counted toward a net gain. Also, the number of members in status quo clubs cannot be counted toward a net gain. For example, if transfers and deaths equal a loss of five and the district has one status quo club with 15 members, then the district would need a membership gain of 21 to achieve a net gain.
- G. The constitutional provision that all districts with membership below the 35/1,250 requirement will not be able to endorse a candidate for international director or second vice president remains valid. These changes are effective immediately.
 - H. Optional position of additional vice district governors:
- I. Any district is permitted to have more than one vice district governor. Establishment of such position is to be determined by delegate vote at the district convention. Details of requirements and administration of said office may be established within the district's constitution and by-laws. Only one elected vice district governor is registered in the records of Lions Clubs International Headquarters and will be the official candidate for the office of district governor.
 - J. District officers' annual club visitation:
- K. It was the boards wish that the annual club visitation is not the major portion of the work governors do. In other words, club visitation should not be a goal itself. District governors are encouraged to share the task of annual club visitation with vice governors, freeing the governors to spend more time on other important areas, and enabling the vice governors to benefit from the experience in preparation for the governors term.
 - L. District officers' role and responsibilities:
- M. The emphasis has been shifted from the administrative role to the leadership role in which the district governor and other district officers can inspire and urge members, especially club officers, to strive for the best achievements. The board re-defined the role and responsibilities of district officers to be voted upon by the delegates during the 2007 Chicago Convention.
 - N. Club Suspension Procedures:
- O. Please be aware that the new club suspension procedures will take effect in July 2007. A club which has an unpaid balance in excess of US\$20 per member or US\$1,000 per club whichever is less, outstanding past 150 days will be automatically suspended including the charter, rights, privileges and obligations of the LionsCclub for a period not to exceed 90 days. Please carefully review the status of all the clubs in the district as shown in the governor's re-cap of accounts, which is sent to governors every month.
 - P. Status Quo Clubs:
- Q. As soon as a club is placed in status quo, the district governor should immediately request the zone chairperson meet with the club to develop a plan to return the club to good standing. Any status quo club may be cancelled at the end of the 90 days if it is not reactivated.
 - R. Club Officer Peporting Form (PU-101):
- S. The deadline for the PU-101 form is May 15, 2007. By submitting this form or filing the information online on time, Lions club's can appear in the International Directory with correct information, and receive communications and publications from International Headquarters throughout the year 2007-2008.
 - T. 100% District Governor Award:
- U. Please check the necessary qualifications to receive this award. If any qualifications are still missing for you, there is enough time to fill the missing qualifications.

Lion George Bonham of Peoria, Illinois invented the Lions Club International white cane after he had watched a blind man trying to cross a busy street using a black cane. Following this, the first white cane ordinance passed in 1930 in Peoria, granting blind pedestrians protection and the right of way while carrying a white

cane. Progress was happening to help the blind!

On October 6, 1964 a joint resolution of Congress was signed into law authorizing the President of the United States to proclaim October 15 of each year as White Cane Safety Day. Each year since 1964, October 15 has been this special day! Did you know this? The long white tool is a tool of freedom and independence.



"They've been there through the thick and the thin," agreed Treasurer Jay Espeseth.


A local chapter must pay \$1,500 to give out each award. The money is used for the Lions' world relief fund.
