





Here's the way it works: Lions Clubs throughout the State of South Dakota have scheduled a Campaign SightFirst II Fund Raiser for the night of Friday, Oct. 5. Following similar successful events in North Dakota following Hurricane Katrina and for Tsunami Relief, every club in South Dakota has been invited to host a Spaghetti Supper to raise funds for CSFII.

Well, the contest is on. Every Lions (and Lioness and Leos) Club in Saskatchewan is invited to try the same idea. But because South Dakota has a head start and because October isn't far away and because many of our clubs are in recess until then, here's how it will work, at least on this side of the 49th parallel:
