Campaign SightFirst II at \$118,000,000

That's worldwide, of course. Also, the recent CSFII Worldwide Report Day conducted Oct. 24 revealed that another \$10,000,000 has been pledged but not formally reported. That means that we are only \$22,000,000 away from our minimum goal of \$150,000,000 and \$72,000,000 away from the total goal of \$200,000,000.

The downside of this, however, is that there are only eight (8) months remaining in the campaign, including this month (November). The three-year fundraising blitz to raise funds for the purpose of controlling and/or eliminating blindness in the world ends June 30, 2008.

Our CSFII sector, Sector D, which includes North Dakota and South Dakota, has done very well in our effort the meet our \$838,383 goal. We have committed -- one way or the other -- about \$526,000. That's in the neighborhood of 2/3rds of the total goal.

The first two-thirds is the easy part. Rounding up the remaining \$312,000 will be a challenge, but it can be done.

How can it be done, you ask. First of all there are 82 clubs in North and South Dakota who have not committed anything to the campaign. That's just under half the clubs in Sector D! If those 82 clubs would commit an average of \$1,000 a year over the next three years we'd be almost there.

What else can we do, you ask? Model Clubs. Sector D has

20 Model Clubs, which is an excellent total, but there are other clubs capable of becoming a Model Club. If we could develop five more Model Clubs in North and South Dakota who commit an average of \$20,000, BAM! We have another \$100,000. A Model Club is one that commits a minimum of \$400 per member to be paid over a 3- to 5-year period.

We must first remember that we are Lions, and this is what we do. We are lucky. We live in the United States of America. We have the resources to help people in other parts of the world who can't help themselves because they aren't so lucky.



A visit to Carrington Lions

Since Jan.1, 2007 to Oct.1, 2007, in all of North Dakota, 214 corneas were recovered, or 107 donors at two corneas each. Of the 214, 165 corneas were successfully transplanted. (49 of these were medical rule outs for transplants). Due to the generous donors and their families, the North Dakota Lions Eye Bank recovery technicians, transporters, and the help of medical staff, 165 people were given the gift of sight.

The Carrington Health Center has trained N.D. Lions Eye Bank technicians to recover donated cornea tissue and the Carrington Lions has a team of five members who regularly transport cornea tissue to Bismarck.



The district also is doing fundraisers and donations for the Northwood Disaster. Keep up the good work!



More then \$3.48 million dollars (US) in grants were approved at the October 2007 LCIF Board Meeting. Fifty-two grants were awarded. 

An update on LCIF

I would like to update you on recent news in LCIF. I ask that you share this information with your club and district to help promote LCIF.

LCIF, Lions respond to California wildfires

LCIF is working with Lions leaders in Southern California to help victims of the California wildfires. A total of US\$45,000 in emergency grants and relief funding has been approved to date. Sixteen fires across the southern part of the state have destroyed more than 1,300 homes and more than 500,000 residents have evacuated. Lions in Districts 4-L6 (San Diegoarea) and 4-L5 have mobilized their emergency response team. Lions in District4-L6 have also set up an online message board for those able to offer assistance or ideas. LCIF continues to work with Lions in southern California to assess the situation and determine a course of action. An LCIF designated account has been established for those wishing to donate to the relief efforts. For updated information, continue to visit our website

Campaign SightFirst II

Programs like SightFirst have made Lions the international leaders in the fight against blindness. Together, we have saved or restored sight to more than 27 million people and improved the vision treatment for hundreds of millions of individuals. Several of these individuals' stories are included in two new DVDs.

New SightFirst publication

To promote the work of Lions and LCIF through the SightFirst program, a new publication titled ForSight has been created. Produced three times a year, ForSight is distributed to current and past international officers, partner organizations, technical advisors, SightFirst chairpersons and other supporters of SightFirst. The August and October issues can be viewed online. Future issues will be available in all official languages. This publication is especially valuable for those considering donating to Campaign SightFirst II.

Sri Lanka hosts Lions World Sight Day

Lions clubs throughout the nation conducted vision screenings for more than 50,000 residents and distributed eyeglasses to those in need on October 7 to mark Lions World Sight Day. Lions also provided free cataract surgery for more than 1,500 people at the two Lions eye hospitals in the area. The surgeries were made possible through an LCIF SightFirst grant. Lions in Colombo, Sri Lanka, also took part in a march through the city's streets in support of Campaign SightFirst II and to promote healthy vision. A seminar on childhood blindness and press conference were also held.

Lions launched World Sight Day, now its in 10th year, to recognize the importance of eradicating preventable blindness around the world. Lions clubs around the world held local activities on World Sight Day to educate their communities about the need to preserve sight.

Key partnerships for Lions Quest

The U.S. State Department's Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs awarded LCIF a second 5-year US\$1.255 million subcontract to provide teacher training and curriculum support for Lions Quest drug prevention in schools in Russia for the first time, as well as expanding current Lions Quest programming in the Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Lithuania and Ukraine.

Lions Clubs International has joined the Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America (CADCA) as a sustaining member and partner to enhance the work of local communities and help youth resist alcohol and other drugs. Lions will support their mission to build stronger capacity for anti-drug efforts through the 5,000 commnict coalitions nationwide.

Grants awarded

More than US\$3.48 million in grants were approved at the October 2007 LCIF Board Meeting. A total of 52 grants were awarded to Lions clubs all over the world to assist many humanitarian projects. This includes a grant for US\$1 million to continue the Special Olympics-Lions Clubs International partnership. Through the partnership more than 100,000 Special Olympics athletes have had their vision screened and 44,000 athletes have received glasses or sport goggles. The deadline to apply for Standard, Core 4 and IAG grants for review at the next board meeting is January 18.
