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INSIDE INTERNATIONAL

There are many ways to recruit new members. Let me count the ways.

Lions Clubs International has been very busy of late reinventing and revitalizing the process we use as Lions to recruit new members for our clubs. We can invite prospective members to take part in a club service project so they can see what we do. We can set up an "open house" or a "rush hour social" to create greater club visibility. We can do lots of things. But mostly, we have to relearn how to ASK. can have fancy handouts, membership development seminars, global membership teams, leadership conferences — you name it. All that may be well and good but nothing will change until we relearn how to ASK.


The ASK has three simple steps.

The ASK a simple first step, an "opening line" let's call it. An opening line should be very simple, should be memorized and used pretty much every time. Most Lions are afraid to ASK to become a member because they don't want to, or are afraid to disturb their comfort zone. This is a very real problem for many people. An opening line helps to get past that initial hurdle more easily. My personal opening line is usually, "Are you a member of a service club". Once you ask your opening line question, you're in the door.

Another phase of the process is FOLLOWUP. followup after the ASK has been accomplished is just as crucial as the ASK itself. You need to obtain the necessary contact information from interested ASKEES for persistent followup purposes. Then, keep after them until they say no. Persistence is the key to success in this

phase.

The third phase is the SPONSOR. Too often, the sponsoring member, who has worked hard to bring the prospect into the

He has brought in four new members in the last few months so I asked him the other day how he went about doing that. He said, "I asked them. Now they are all Lions members. What did he do? He ASKED. No brochures, no fancy stuff, he just ASKED.

Dickinson 2013 Lions convention update

Hello fellow Lions:

Your 2013 State Lions Convention MEETING OF THE MINDS is progressing nicely. By special agreement with our District Governor Lewellyn Rustan, we have extended the deadline for early registration from April 1 to April 13 – that's right – the date of the 5NW Spring Rally in Garrison!

We will also raffle off a free Convention Registration at the Spring Rally, so YOU have extra reasons to be THERE! We have lots to report, so have a seat, do your reading and YES! send in a registration form with your check or come to the Spring Rally and try your luck. One of our ongoing concerns remains the housing shortage in Dickinson. With recent Bakken Activities, room occupancy has been hovering near the 90 percent level.

Now the truly great news is that there has also been a LOT of construction going on – including motels and hotels to take up the slack. In this past year, occupancy rates have dipped below the 70 percent level in many of these motels which makes it a lot easier to get a room and, for our purpose, also a bit more competitive price-wise.

We have a new room rate from the Ramada Grand Dakota Lodge (Convention HQ) of \$109 per night. There are several other motels within easy walking distance, and Our Dickinson Lion Vincent Biesoit has done some shopping for you.

Meeting the Ramada rate is the Comfort Inn on 493 Elk Dr (264-7300); At even more competetive (\$99/night) rates are the Best Western Plus located at 475 15th St W (456-8400) and the Astoria Hotels&Suites located at 363 15th St W (456-5000). Each of these motels have reserved a block of 20 rooms that they will hold until 9/25/13.

We also felt that we should share some of the details we have been working on. Our featured speaker at breakfast will be the Make a Wish Representative for North Dakota. This person will inspire you and make you grateful for the work they do for these terminally ill kids.

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As I continue my visits, I find that members of Lion's Clubs in District 5NE are going about their business as Lions, serving the needs of their communities and contributing to the needs of people world-wide. As I visit the clubs throughout the district, I am constantly impressed with the commitment and dedication of the club members. They are great people doing what Lions do "providing Service."

Club visits are enjoyable and exciting

I have completed more than 45 Club visitations and I have found each of the visits to be an enjoyable, exciting experience. About half of the 60 clubs in SNE meet on Monday evening and that coupled with the regular Monday night Winter Storm and Blizzard Warnings has resulted in some cancellations and has made traveling an exciting challenge.

Membership challenging but improved

Membership continues to be a challenge and will perhaps continue to be a challenge until and/or unless we find a way to alter the club meetings format to better fit into the busy world of today's instant communication society. Membership in SNE this year has improved when compared to other years. SNE started off the year by being the recipient of the Lions International's FAST START CRUISING SPEED AWARD which was awarded districts having an increased net membership as of October 31, 2012.

We have; however, not kept up that pace as the year progresses and as of the end of February our total club assessment report shows a decrease in membership of 16 members in the district. That number is being challenged because the NDSU club inducted more than 30 members and all of the clubs new members do not appear on the Club Health Assessment Report.

District 5NE has not gained or lost any clubs this year. One club was cancelled early in the year because they had not submitted their dues for an extended period of time; however, after further

consideration they have changed their mind and are submitting the funds and will be reinstated. District SNE is also proud to announce the formation of a new Leo's Club at Davies High School in Fargo.

Lions clubs must become "Agents of change"


I am extremely concerned about the long-term viability of many of the clubs in our district and have continually visited with the membership about International President, Wayne Madden's suggestion that Lions Clubs need to become agents of change.

I encourage club members to develop web sites, Facebook pages and other tools of communication used by younger generations as a way to attract new members. I am encouraged by the fact that I find a lot of the Lions members of all ages are Facebook users and I see a lot of members shaking their head in agreement with the need to use more social media tools.

I have contacted the Senior Director of one of the world's major high-tech computer software companies with a large operation in Fargo, promoting the concept of starting an in-house Lions club(s) using a meeting format designed by the employees that is workable for the technology-savvy, service minded people employed in that facility. My hope is that we can see what works for them and adopt some of their strategies to enhance membership in service clubs throughout District 5NE, the nation and the world.

The service club membership challenge is not an issue that is only experienced by Lions, but is an issue facing most service clubs throughout the country. We need to find a way to make service club membership s work in today's instant communication society.

I am particularly optimistic because the company's Senior Director recognizes the challenges facing service clubs and indicated that he likes the creative thinking that went into the process and is going to share it with the various leaders within



the world-wide organization. Perhaps we can come up with a meeting format and a club operation format that works better in today's society.

5NE club officers encouraged to attend training sessions

Most club officers do an exceptional job meeting the responsibilities of the office to which they have been elected. There are; however, some officers who, either because they do not have access to the LCI web site, have not had sufficient training or choose not to do it, have not submitted the club's information in a timely manner.

According to the District 5NE Club Health Assessment through March 2013, a number of clubs have not submitted their membership reports for more than three months with three clubs who have not submitted a report for more than a year. Activity reports also appear to be a challenge with some clubs who have not submitted an activity report for more than two years even though their clubs are very active and are involved in many interesting, exciting projects serving their community and the world. There are also a very small number of clubs who have not submitted their dues and their balances are more than 90 days old.

All club officers are encouraged to attend the training session in your area. This year, as during the past two years, officer training for District 5NE is being provided in your zone eliminating your need to travel. "Amazing things can happen, when we aren't limited by myths."

There are many widely held beliefs regarding bringing members of the 'younger generations' into our Lions Clubs.

I recently attended the Make-A-Wish Benefit sponsored by the Dickinson Noon Lions Club. It prompted me to share with you some of my observations. I call them, "Myths about the 'younger generations'."

- They don't get involved in community organizations.
- They don't support community activities.
- They don't spend time on community projects.
 - They are too busy.
 - They won't go to meetings.
 - It's hard to get females to join.

Does that describe the Dickinson Noon Lions Club's members? No, it does not.

The club, chartered in 1999, has thirteen members. Eight of them are female. They range in age from 26. Only three of them are over 45 years of age.

More than half of them are not yet 40 years old. I'd call that 'younger generations' Lions. And a lot of female Lions, to boot.

The Make-A-Wish Benefit was supported by every one of them: More than a dozen club and committee meetings. More than 200 hours committed to the project; planning, preparing, securing donations and prizes, selling raffle tickets, promoting, wrap-up. Plus the event itself.

Let's not forget the crowd, estimated at 600 people in attendance. Truly a family affair, they ranged in age from 14 months to senior citizens. An estimate puts the average age somewhere in the 40's.

That's the crowd that paid for dinners, raffle tickets, and participated in the silent and live auctions. The average age of the bidders and buyers was estimated to be in the upper 40's. Another group of 'younger generations'.

They paid more than 200% of the retail value of the donated auction items. On average. One item brought \$3,100. High bidder was a young man, certainly one of

the 'younger generations.'

Several of the purchased items were donated back to be sold again, or given to one of the children in the Make-A-Wish program. Average price of those items was probably \$500-\$600. Yep, donated back by some of those 'younger generations' bidders

There was nothing so unusual about this year's Make-A-Wish Benefit. It was their 12th annual benefit, which has steadily grown in popularity and support. The first year it raised \$7,500. Last year it netted \$72,000. And this year, more than \$90,000.

Project Chair Lion Kelly Braun said, "I am absolutely overwhelmed by the generosity. It's become a social event that people come to every year. For us Lions, this is what we came here for. They have a passion to help the kids."

That clearly explains why these 'younger generations' Lions have made this such an event. They have a passion for what they do, and they do it their way.

This project may be their main activity for the entire year, but it perhaps ranks near the total of what other Lions clubs accomplish in that year. A visiting Lion from another club remarked to Kelly, "That's more than we do all year!"

I'm not suggesting that what the Dickinson Noon Lions Club does is more significant than what is done by other clubs. But it certainly is a great example of how one club has overcome all the 'myths' I listed at the beginning of this article.

We know that younger people today do not want to do things the same way they've been done since the Lions organization was founded nearly 100 years ago. Things are done differently today. The future of Lions depends upon finding ways to help them do it their way. They have the same need to help the less fortunate, and they experience the same inner rewards that make us older Lions do what we do.

Kelly admitted, "By the time we get to the end of this, we're tired!" It's a lot of work, for several weeks.



Two of the Dickinson Noon Lions are charter members. The rest of them became members after the club began doing the Make-A-Wish benefits. They didn't become Lions in spite of the work. They became Lions because of it.

People want to be part of a group that is doing something significant. Something that stirs that passion to help, to be involved in making a difference, To be part of something bigger than themselves, something worthwhile.

Ya gotta love those 'younger generations'. They're a wonderful, generous, caring group of people. The kind of people that make wonderful Lions!

If people are not eager to join our club, perhaps we've set our sights a bit too low. Perhaps we're busy doing things that just don't touch the hearts of those who are watching. Perhaps we're not doing things that are meaningful to them.

There is one very simple way to change that: Participate seriously in a Club Excellence Process. You might be very surprised by the results!

PROPOSED CHANGES TO MD 5 CONSTITUTION, BY LAWS & STANDING OPERATING PROCEDURES – TO BE VOTED ON AT THE MD 5 CONVENTION IN YORKTON, SASKATCHEWAN - JUNE 7 & 8, 2013

The MD5 Long Range Planning Committee, in conjunction with the Constitution and Bylaws Committee met at the November 2012 Council of Governors meeting in Minot ND to work on several issues related to the committee structure of the multiple district.

The purpose of this meeting was to focus on the following tasks related to committees:

- 1. Clarify duties of committee chairs.
- 2. Simplify the process for nomination/appointment of committee chairs.
 - 3. Determine terms of office.
- 4. Create a balance between states and province when appointing/rotating committee chairs.

The committees went through the current constitution, by-laws, and standard operating procedures and made suggestions for clarifying these items. It was decided to follow the duties and responsibilities established by LCI for the standing and LCI committees. The process for nomination/appointment was simplified to have Council Chair establish a nominating committee to identify people to serve in the different committees. The CC will consider appointees between the districts and will recommend to the Council a slate of committee chairs for approval to terms, as indicated by LCI (see below). Terms of office will follow LCI suggestions. MD5 committees will follow annual appointment, unless otherwise specified.

The committees were identified as:

- Standing Committees established by LCI as three-year appointments (e.g., GMT, GLT, Leo, Quest, and Youth Camp & Exchange)
- LCI Committees established by LCI as annual appointments (e.g., Convention, International Relations, LOFY, Lions Services for Children, PR and Lions Information, Information Technology, Sight Preservation Awareness and Action, Diabetes Awareness and Action, Hearing Preservation Awareness and Action, and Lions ALERT), Protocol
- MD5 Committees established by MD5 as part of council and ongoing priorities (e.g., Long

Range Planning, Constitution and By Laws, Budget and Finance, Credentials, Centennial Planning, Pin, International Contests and Presidential Theme)
The VDG Trainer's line of appointment through the GLT and GMT committees, to the Membership and Leadership Council committee, to the COG was clarified.

Additional items were discussed that needed attention:

- 1. Constitution and by-laws changes recommended by last year's committee. The changes will be incorporated into the proposal.
- 2. Discussion of VDG training using online and face-to-face delivery systems was suggested as a possibility.
- 3. VDG curriculum assessment was discussed. The documents were presented to the full Council of Governors. Each item was reviewed and a few items were added:
- 1. Membership on LRP committee was modified to include secretary-treasurer.
- 2. A financial prize was established as an award for the new Lions Club with the highest percentage of members present at the convention.
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- 4. A financial prize was established as an award for the new Lions Club with the highest percentage of members present at the convention.

After discussion, the foregoing report was moved and approved by the Council of Governors and the proposed changes to the MD 5 Constitution, By Laws and Standing Operating Procedures will be presented for ratification at the MD5 Annual General Meeting to be held at the MD 5 Convention in Yorkton Jun 7 – 8, 2013.

I only wish I could bottle the self-confidence and happiness they bring home from camp to open up on one of those bad days.

Last spring, we had the opportunity to participate in the 'Strides Walk' sponsored by the Mandan Dacotah Lions. It was meaningful in that it allowed us to do something positive as a family to promote awareness of diabetes and to raise money to send children to Camp Sioux."




