



## NDAB Seeks Nominations

The North Dakota Association of the Blind, Inc., once again is seeking nominations for the Robert John LePage Service Award. Last year's recipient of the award, Paul Nelson of the Gateway Lions of Fargo, received his award at the banquet during NDAB's state convention, which was held in Devils Lake last June.

The Robert John LePage Service Award was established in 2008 in honor of the more than twenty-four years of service that Bob had contributed to people with sight loss. In memory of Bob's service, NDAB is asking that the various Lions Clubs of North Dakota consider submitting the name of one of their members who exemplifies Bob's spirit of selfless, but generally unrecognized, assistance to people who are blind or who have low vision. The person who will be chosen for this award is not necessarily the one who has held the most offices or who has been recognized in other ways, but the one who has been working quietly behind the scenes in providing humble, yet very important, service to

people who are blind or who have low vision. Please feel free to resubmit the name of someone who has not been selected in the past, as it has always been difficult to make a selection from so many worthy nominees.

All applications will be reviewed by a committee of NDAB members, and one individual will be chosen to receive the Award. Please submit your nominee's application by March 31, 2018, and include the following information: the individual's name, club name, contact information for both yourself and the nominee, a letter outlining the types of service provided to individuals with sight loss within the community, the number of years as a Lions member, and a brief letter from the club President.

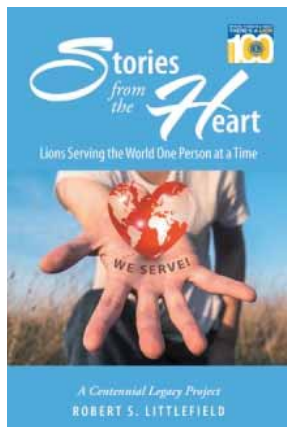

## Lions Foundation awards sight grants

Five grants were awarded at the January Lions Foundation of North Dakota board of directors meeting. All five grants were awarded from the recently established Sight Fund Grant Program.

The Bismarck Lions Club, and the Mandan West River Lions Club, each requested the maximum \$250 for people needing assistance to purchase eye glasses.

The Fargo Gateway Lions Club, and the Oaks Lions Club, each requested \$250, and the Regent Lions Club requested \$50, all to assist the North Dakota School For The Blind's Family Weekend Project.

These were the first grants awarded from the Sight Fund Grant Program established when the former Lions Eye Bank of North Dakota was dissolved. The funds were given to the Lions Foundation of North Dakota, and a separate fund was created to assist with sight and vision related projects. The contest is open to students who are 11, 12, or 13 years of age. Complete rules are included in the contest kit which is available from LCI now. Order PPK1 kits through the Lions web site. Remember, the deadlines listed by LCI are suggestions only. Since the District 5NE poster winner is selected at the State Convention in Grand Forks on Oct 17 – 18, 2018, waiting until next fall makes it hard to get the program introduced into the school schedule. Those clubs that have done the contest before are already geared up to do it again and they have great participation from the students. A lesser known contest is the Speak-Off contest sponsored by MD5. # Lions Foundation Preview

“The Lions Foundation of North Dakota was established to mirror the Lions Clubs International Foundation, with North Dakota beneficiaries, rather than international beneficiaries.”

Greetings to all Lions from your Foundation President. It is an honor “to serve” on the Foundation Board of Directors and a joy to be able to help provide needed financial assistance to Lions Clubs, individuals and families throughout our state.

Membership in the Foundation is comprised of elected Lions from Districts 5NE and 5NW. The elections take place during the District meetings at the annual State Convention. Each term is three years (beginning in July) unless someone is appointed to fill a vacancy in which case they complete that term and then are eligible for election to a three year term. A person may be re-elected to a second full term. It’s very important to understand the necessity of being available to attend the quarterly Board meetings if you are interested in being elected to the Board. A quorum of eight is the minimum requirement in order to hold an official meeting. Over the past several years we have tried to make it easier to attend by offering a remote internet connection option for anyone who is not able to attend in person. The Board has voted to recommend to the District Governors that anyone who has more than two unexcused absences in a year should be removed from the Board. The Executive Director of the Foundation is Lion Lois Reiersen, Williston. The Executive Director position is appointed annually by approval of the Executive Board consisting of the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. This is a non-voting position but holds many responsibilities within the Foundation.

The basic sources of income for the Foundation are through individual and club donations plus investments. A donor may designate the money to be included in one of three funds maintained by the Foundation or, if the donation is undesignated, 50% will go into the Permanent Fund, 25% into the Grant Fund and 25% to the Operating Fund. All donations are to be recognized by the Foundation in the North Dakota Lion magazine in addition to banner patches for Club donations and pins with bars for individual donations. A \$300 Life Membership Gift is another wonderful way of recognizing a faithful member of your Club.

The Foundation has chosen to invest Permanent Funds into interest or dividend bearing accounts. The interest or dividends

accrued are then equally transferred to the Grant and Operating accounts (50% to each) monthly or quarterly. Following the merger of the North Dakota Eye Bank with South Dakota to form Dakota Lions Sight and Health, a bond investment account along with about \$70,000 in cash was turned over to the NDLF. In accordance with our investment policy, only the earnings on the investments can be used for grants and operating expenses as stated above. However, the cash transfer has given the Foundation additional options to pursue.

By agreement with the former Eye Bank Executive Board, a Vision-related Grant Program has been established to cover the period from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018 with annual renewal and modification options. Any ND Lions Club in good standing with Lions Clubs International may submit a grant application during this period. Forms are available online at our website, ndlions.org or by contacting our Executive Director, Lois Reiersen. Grants will be a 50% reimbursement match, up to \$250 (\$500 actual expense of applicant), on monies spent on vision related activities/equipment/procedures during FY 2017-2018. Applicant must provide proof of expenditure with the application. This proof may be a copy of a cancelled check, paid invoice, or receipt.

The original Grant program operated by the Foundation since 2009, is still an option for ND Lions Clubs. Once again, forms are available online or from Executive Director Lois Reiersen. The two main questions that need to be answered for acceptance of this Grant application are: Does the project benefit North Dakota Communities? And, is the project conducted by North Dakota Lions Clubs? In other words, is it a Lions

project or are the Lions trying to raise money for someone else’s project? The amount of the grant is limited to no more than 50% of the total cost of the project. In addition, the total amount of grants awarded at any meeting will be limited to no more than 25% of funds in the Grant Fund, unless approved by a 75% majority vote of certified voters at a properly called meeting of the Board of Directors. All grants must be received by the Executive Director not less than 30 days prior to the Board meeting where the application will be decided.

Important programs within the umbrella of the NDLF are the Video Magnifier Program, Sight 4 Kidz, and Eyeglass Recycling. The North Dakota Lion magazine is proofed by the Foundation President and Executive Director and is paid for by club assessments that are administrated by the Foundation. To that end, we would strongly recommend that Lion members request through your club secretary and to the LFND Executive Director to have your ND Lion sent to you via an email connection rather than a hard copy. Our mailing costs are more than the production costs so it behooves us to lower our costs wherever possible.

In closing, be thinking about Lions projects where your club might need some financial assistance especially with eye glasses and exams. Strongly consider ways you and your club can contribute financially to YOUR State Foundation. And finally, I encourage you to think about becoming a member of the Lions Foundation. Speak with any current Board member, local club leader, or your Zone and District Executive Team members. It’s a great experience and another way to say “WE SERVE”!

### SECTION F – Biography

Prepare a personal resume including name, marital status, family, occupation and when and where you joined Lions. Include all achievements, volunteer work, other organizations and personal recognitions. Section F is limited to 500 words but must be more than 250 words. It will be judged on content, clarity, structure and presentation. Although a set number of points will not be used for this section, the Selection Committee will give significant weight to the biography as they evaluate the application. This section is to be in narrative form only, with optional third person construction.

### SECTION G – Nominee Certification

7. Each District Governor will be responsible for coordinating their District speak-off contest within their district. The District winner will provide an electronic file recording of the speech for the Multiple District contest.
8. The Governor will also be responsible for obtaining an electronic file of the winning speech and forward it to Lion Gale Hyde for the MD 5 Speak-off Contest.

### Other information:

1. Local lions club or Zones can sponsor a contest. Several clubs can join together and sponsor a contest. Inform your schools about the contest. For further information on judging, please contact PDG Tim Thueson at [tthueson@bis.midco.net](mailto:tthueson@bis.midco.net).
2. The winner of the local contest will then advance to the District competition. In the event that no local club or Zone contest is held; the District Governor can hold a district wide contest. Please check with your District Governor for dates of their District competition.
