

This year we delivered our largest lions symbol along with our logo and centennial trade mark on our largest Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade Float to the world. The Lions float was seen in over 200 countries. The stats indicated that 70 million people watched the float on television and an additional 2.5 million saw the float on-line. One million people saw the float along the parade route.

Be proud. Lions and Leos spent thirty-three thousand volunteer hours to plan and decorate the float. We did the project ahead of schedule. Be proud that every non-lion who visited the float barn during the decorating process commented on our dedication to detail and commitment to our float project.

We heard great stories of service relating to vision and hunger and how it impacted lives and we were thanked. Others asked what are Lions and we had members happily explain our mission.

Hello District 4-L2 Lions:

This New Year holds many great events: Melvin Jones' Birthday, Student Speakers Contests, MD-4 Convention and the anniversary of 100 years of Lionism, just to name a few.

Speaking of our MD-4 Convention, I just wanted to touch base for those Lions who could not make it to our last District Meeting. There is a proposed item delegates will be voting on at our Convention and that is the MD-4 dues increase of \$4.00 per year. Before you panic, please allow me to explain. I am serving on the MD-4 Budget Committee and we worked long and hard to avoid an increase, however, each year money has been transferred out of the reserve to the point that the reserve is getting very low. In order to continue the great services that MD-4 provides, an increase will be necessary. The last dues increase for MD-4 was in 2003, 14 years ago! Since that time, we have enjoyed many training classes, a Leadership Institute added to the Southern California area (Ontario), which many of us have had the advantage to attend and graduate. Fifteen 2nd VDG positions were added as well which allows more training for all to advance to District Governor with the necessary time to learn to lead our Districts! I am encouraging a "yes" vote at the MD-4 Convention in Redding. The increase is \$4.00 which equals to .01 cents a day, 33 cents a month, \$1.00 a quarter or \$2.00 semi-annually! This increase will allow MD-4 to build our reserve back and continue the great services we have come to expect from MD-4. I know District 4-L2 has always done what is right for all, so please join me and my club in voting yes on the \$4.00 dues increase at the February Convention in Redding.

I look forward to seeing many of you at our upcoming events!

An Important Message from our Cabinet Secretary Nancy McAfee.

Attention Club Officers:

Lions Clubs International passed a new bylaw last year regarding voting at District, State or International Conventions.

All club dues must be paid **in full 30 days prior to the start of the convention** (previously it was 15 days). For District 4-L2 this also includes MD-4 dues. Club Treasurers (or the address on file with the MD-4 office) will be receiving statements/invoices for January-July, 2017 dues soon. Please make sure that all club dues to LCI and MD-4 are current by January 9, 2017, to be able to vote at the MD-4 Convention in February, 2017. Deadline is April 18, 2017, for our District 4-L2 Convention in May, 2017.

Also, elections for 2017-2018 club officers is fast approaching. This is an early reminder that your new officers (PU-101) must be reported to Lions Clubs International via **mylci** website by **May 15, 2017**. If you will be reporting by handwritten form, it must be received by Lions Clubs International by May 15, 2017.

A New Resolution for 2017: DONATE TO LCIF

By the time you read this it will be 2017, and you may or may not have made one or more New Year's resolutions. Whether you have or haven't, here's one to seriously consider: resolve to donate to Lions Clubs International's only official charity, the Lions Club International Foundation, and to encourage everyone in your club to do the same.

Only 8 Clubs in 4-L2 Presently Donate

We know that some of you do donate, either occasionally or on a regular basis. We also know that as of the end of November 2016 only 16.67% of our district's membership (8 out of 48 clubs) have at least one member who has donated to our charity. Donations don't have to be large in amount. For as little as \$20 you can become a "Contributing Member" and receive a recognition pin.

Becoming a 100% Club

Your club can become a 100% club if each member donates that minimum of \$20 to the Foundation with all contributions being submitted together with the individual names of the donors. The club is awarded a patch, and each contributor receives a special pin. Of course, contributions of \$50 or \$100 are also accepted in this program, and all contributions count toward achieving a Melvin Jones Fellowship or Progressive MJF. The donations can also be designated for a particular program, such as for the "\$1, One Shot" LCIF initiative to eradicate measles, which concludes this year. This is an ideal way for small clubs to become distinguished for their support of our charity.

Debunking an Oft-Repeated Myth

Over the years we've often heard the myth repeated that all the money collected by LCIF goes off in grants to other countries. Since the Foundation was formed, our own district has received almost \$500,000 in grants for such projects as fire relief, purchasing vans for vision care services; for the Blind Children's Center and for the Whittier Boys and Girls Club, Habitat for Humanity Builds, equipment for eye clinics and more. Here in Multiple District 4-California, grants have totaled nearly \$6 million.

Taiwanese Lions Provide Eye Screening Service

On November 19th, San Gabriel Taiwanese Lions Club joined force with with the LA Taiwan Center and Lions Mobil Health Screening Unit and held an eye screening service to the general public at the Taiwan Center in the city of Rosemead. With the professional help from two MD's Lisa Yang and Chester Cheng, along with two medical students as their assistants, approximately 60 people were given very thorough eye screenings and consultations. Eighteen Lions came out to serve as a team. On site, San Gabriel Taiwanese Lions also provided refreshments and a gift bag to those who came. The event was covered by major media outlets both in printed media and on television. This was the 14th year that the San Gabriel Taiwanese Lions provided health screening service to the underserved communities.

PARADE OF NATIONS IN CHICAGO!!!

One of the highlights of the Lions International Convention is the "Parade of Nations". For those who have never attended the Convention, this parade is like no others that you have seen. There will be about 25,000 Lions that will participate, including our delegation from California which will be led by the University of Illinois Marching Band from Champaign.

Special permission has been received to march on State Street. The parade will be Saturday, July 1st stepping off at 9:00a.m. at the corner of State Street and Wacker Drive. The parade will proceed south down State Street to Van Buren Street. Buses will be there to help the participants return to McCormick Place.

The marching order of the parade will be led by the International Officers, followed by more than 150 delegations from around the world. Throughout the parade there will be marching bands and floats that will be depicting the history of Lionism throughout the world.
