District Lions Clubs International Foundation Report Submitted by PDG Manny Sanchez, District LCIF Chair

Fellow Lions:

Welcome to the 2018-2019 Lions year. I am pleased to be assigned as the District's LCIF Coordinator. Under the 2017-2018 LCIF Leadership of Lion Nancy McAfee, our District's total contributions were \$55,333.08, combined with the Multiple District Four for a total of \$621,299.58. The top club donors were Downtown Long Beach-\$8,749 (\$1,170 to Disaster Relief); Pasadena Host-\$9,484.08 (to Disaster Relief and Measles); and the San Gabriel Taiwanese-\$17,200 (\$15,200 to Disaster Relief). Our overall club participation was 54.17%. Thank you to PCC Roger Powell and Lion Nancy McAfee for this information.

As you are all aware of the California Wildfires, LCIF has been using the disaster funds in California. We are not finished, since the fire season arrived early this year. This will follow with the rainy season and the potential mud slides. **Your donations are much needed** here in California and around the world. In the past, we have received grants to purchase a van for the Blind Children's Center, a van for the Whittier Boy's and Girl's Club, The Mobile Health Screening Unit and the four Spot Vision Screening Units. We are happy to announce that LCIF has granted us five (5) additional Spot Vision Screeners. These are **YOUR** donation dollars at work!

This year, LCIF – Your Foundation – proudly introduces Campaign 100: LCIF Empowering Service. The most ambitious fundraising effort in LCIF's history. Campaign 100 will span three (3) years and seek to raise US\$300 million by June 30, 2021. Campaign 100 will empower Lions to serve 200+ million people a year. More information when I meet with your Clubs and Club Coordinators.

Club LCIF Coordinators: I have identified some of you but not all. In the next month, I will be reaching out to you to schedule a training session. If your club does not have a coordinator, then I can work with you to identify one. On the topic of visitations, I am happy to give your club an LCIF Program. I can customize the presentation to fit your needs. I will be contacting clubs soon.

Save the date, Melvin Jones Awards Luncheon is scheduled for Sunday, February 17, 2019, at 1:00p.m. at the Rio Hondo Event Center in Downey. This is a great opportunity to present your member with a Melvin Jones Fellowship.
