SVDG training will begin this upcoming summer. So those of you who are moving into that position watch for upcoming emails and info regarding the training sessions.

We are looking forward to continuing our travels and to the experiences we will have.

Attention Club Presidents, Secretaries, and Admins The New Lion Portal is coming very soon! The transition to the new Lion Portal is scheduled to begin on April 12th. Best practices for this sort of change encourages those impacted to be proactive such as the following. • Club Secretary or President or Admin best practice is to input all membership updates such as changes to emails, addresses, phone numbers before April 12th into MyLCI. Club Secretary or President or Admin best practice is to report all club activity, including service activities, meetings, donations, and fundraisers. This reporting needs to be done in MyLion before April 12th. Club Secretary or President or Admin best practice is to download membership data for the entire club so it can be verified against data in the new Lion Portal when it becomes available. To download data, go to MyLCI, My Lions Club, Data Download, Member Data, Select All, check box "By downloading this information...", click View/Print. Save resulting file to your computer. Do this before April 12th. • Club Secretary or President or Admin best practice is to download activity data for the entire club so it can be verified against data in the new Lion Portal when it becomes available. To download data, go to MyLion, Metrics, Export, Save resulting file to your computer. Do this before April 12th. • **Key dates to be aware of** (keep in mind that dates may change as transition moves forward): April 12 and beyond: MyLion, MyLCI, and Insights are no longer available. • April 15-May 13: Invitations to access the new Lion Portal via email on a rolling basis to existing Lion Account users. May 13 and beyond: All visitors attempting to access the previous digital tools will be automatically redirected to the new portal. • **NOTE:** Based on this timeline, the new Lion Portal will be available in time for new club officers to be processed before the May 15th deadline. Any year end member additions or drops are to be processed before June 30th. Learn about these 4 tiles that will provide access in the new Lion Portal:

Planet vs Plastics



You may ask why plastic? After all, plastics have saved countless lives in the medical sector, provided clean energy from wind turbines/solar panels, and made improvements in food storage safety. Why has this "miracle material" become demoniacal??

This year's Earth Day theme is *"Planet vs Plastic"* - emphasizing the need to reduce, by 60%, <u>the</u> <u>use of single use plastic.</u> Single use includes plastic bottles/cups, plates, eating utensils, unnecessary food wrappings and throw-away paper products; i.e. paper towels, one-use table cloths. "Multi use plastics" (ex; storage containers) do not harm as much because they are not immediately discarded.

Let's concentrate on the biggest villain- plastic water bottles. Did you know that it takes at least 450 years for a plastic bottle to degrade and while it does, micro bits wear off and are ingested by our food supply. It is estimated that globally, over 1 million water bottles are purchased each day and that water bottle sales outnumber soda, juices and beer sales combined.

What can we do about it?? Simply, switch to a reusable water bottle- there are so many varieties on the market – now it is "cool" to be carrying one. Otherwise, recycle in appropriate containers, look for unwrapped fruit/vegetables at the supermarket, and chose only products that you may reuse in a variety of ways.

Just remember, Mother Earth is our planet - we must strive to protect her!

Cabinet Meeting Recap

The third cabinet meeting of the year took place on March 10th at the Atkinson Country Club. There were 96 people in attendance representing 20 clubs in the district plus 8 clubs in district 44N. PCC Bob Gustafson from the Atkinson Lions Club welcomed everyone to Atkinson. We were encouraged to visit the Atkinson Village Store for any shopping needs before leaving Atkinson later in the day. There were several reports to update us on activities in the district including Club Officer Training on April 27th; the newly formed NH Lions Green Team encouraging clubs to become zero waste clubs; registration is open for our Spring Convention; most clubs are actively inviting new members and providing service in their communities. It was noted that our district has collected 83,676 eyeglasses for recycling this year. Active LEO clubs are making a difference, and Lion Neeta Masand shared that what she thought was going to be providing a favor by advising a LEO club has turned into a favor to her for the opportunity to work with inspiring young individuals. Several speakers expressed the importance of reporting ALL of our service. As Lions, our brand is service; it's what we need to be known for. We actually DO much more than what is being reported; help is available through DG Kamal if you struggle to get your service reported. Over 700 bears have been distributed through the Hugs & Cuddle project. Courses are available to every Lion; some are online and some are in person – we can all learn more about what it means to be a Lion. We are encouraged to retain members and invite new ones to join us. The push behind achieving 1.5 million Lions is to be able to serve more people around the world – the lofty goal is to serve 1 billion people each year. There are several initiatives being worked on to help us accomplish more. Our district will surpass our LCIF donation goal this year. Clubs are encouraged to budget a portion of charitable gaming towards LCIF donations. The Credentials and Nominations Committee has confirmed the qualified candidates for our ballot for the upcoming vote for next year's leaders. Several committees provided reports; refer to the "District Org Happenings" section in this newsletter. Camp Pride awarded the "Choo" award to Phil Busby for his dedication to the improvement of the camp. Congratulations to the 11 clubs who achieved Club Excellence last year: Atkinson, Chester, Hampstead, Hudson, Loudon, Meredith, Nashua, Portsmouth, Salem, Wakefield, and Wolfeboro. ID Steve Middlemiss thanked the clubs who have participated in donating towards solar ovens for Kenya through a service project he encountered while in Kenya. Thank you Hudson, Loudon, Nashua, and Salem Lions Clubs for your donations. If interested in learning more, contact ID Steve. Electronic Waste Collection Day Laconia-Gilford Lions Club April 6 Gilford Cinemas 8 parking lot, Gilford 8:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.



Got an old computer collecting dust in your closet, or a broken air conditioner sitting on the back porch? What do you do with such items when you replace them? Everything from laptops, phones and computers to TVs cost a fortune to haul away.

Turn all that junk over to the Laconia-Gilford Lions Club during their Electronic Waste Collection Day fundraising event which will be held on Saturday, April 6, in the Cinemas 8 parking lot in Gilford (9 Old Lake Shore Road) from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. **Note: this is a new location as of a few years ago.** For a small disposal fee, not only will we take your old electronic items off your hands, we will recycle them. The disposal charge is almost always less than the prices at local transfer stations. **Cash or checks will be accepted but not debit or credit cards**.

Just bring your electronics to Cinemas 8 parking lot, 9 Old Lakeshore Road in Gilford on Saturday, April 6, between 8:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Lions Club members will even help you unload them! You do not have to be a resident of Laconia or Gilford to take advantage of this fundraiser - it is open to everyone.

Items you may want to consider dropping off are laptops, PC towers, PC LCD monitors, servers, CD/DVD players, camcorders, AV equipment, VCRs, speakers, copiers, faxes, scanners, printers, phones (land and cell), phone systems, humidifiers, and computer accessories (all \$5 unless very large).

In addition, we will also take microwaves, air conditioners, dehumidifiers (all \$10), CRT monitors less than 50 lbs. and TVs less than 25" (\$20), TVs 26" and larger (\$30). For TVs needing more than one person to lift or CRT monitors over 50 lbs., the item will be weighed on site and the price determined. Anything with a cord not listed will also be accepted.

We are also now accepting Teflon pots and pans for \$1.

You CANNOT drop off: smoke detectors, oils, paints, thinners, batteries (except car batteries), tires, items containing mercury such as fluorescent and CFL light bulbs or thermometers, capacitors, ballasts, or any other hazardous waste.

Don't miss this opportunity or you'll be storing these things another year - "Don't throw it out, Recycle it!" You'll not only help the environment by disposing of your unwanted electronics responsibly but also help the Lions, the largest service organization in the world, raise funds to meet pressing needs in our community: eye exams, eyeglasses, hearing aids, food pantries, college scholarships, holiday food baskets for needy families, youth sports programs, are just a few of the local charitable organizations that we assist. All that for a disposal fee that, in most cases, is less than the cost at local transfer stations.




