Each year the newly elected district leadership spends countless hours in training classes and developing the goals for their upcoming year. Each of us believes this will make the district, clubs, and membership stronger than the year before. History has clearly shown us that this isn't always the case.

A common objective each year is to Serve the needs of our local communities. To achieve this goal, local clubs have a wide range of projects. Many of these projects are run annually and on occasion projects targeting a new area of need are added in. While this activity is going on, local clubs strive to engage their members in an attempt to keep them involved- to provide a purpose for why they remain a member of the organization.

Locally the district and clubs are reminded that new membership is important as it fosters more manpower, new ideas and new areas of interest – new voices.

Below is a four-year snapshot of our district membership activity and a demographic of who we are.

The current district membership profiles as 49% women and 51% men. Our membership falls in the following age groups: 18-45 19%, 50-65 8% and 66+ 73%. We have a history of adding a few new clubs and then dropping a few clubs over several years. We need a strong group of guiding lions to help prevent this from repeating.

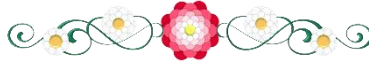
Using the data above seems logical to project our next year's goals. The goals given to us by LCI regarding Mission 1.5 are as follows: new members 167, drops 84; a net growth of 83. The big question is how we can achieve these goals.

We will need a strong Global Membership Team, Global Extension Team, and Guiding Lions consisting of 10-12 lions that are willing to put the time in to chartering 2-3 new clubs and the continued performance of the existing clubs. This will take a commitment from several Lions and several clubs choosing to make a difference.

Service across the district remains strong. Year to date the Service Events total 1,597. People Served is 185,257. Volunteer Hours are 29,523. Dollars Raised are \$1,040,240 and Dollars Donated are \$496,000. Great job!

I plan to be at both Conventions to support, and personally thank, the candidates and I hope to see many New Hampshire Lions as well.

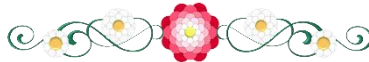


Michelle Ackroyd, Childhood Cancer Chair

As the American Cancer Society's childhood cancer initiative, Gold Together empowers individuals to help raise funds to directly support research, education, advocacy, and services, as well as promote cancer prevention efforts that could reduce children's risk for cancer later in life.

Research that reaches Kids- The American Cancer Society funds scientists who conduct innovative research on childhood cancer. As of March 1, 2021, they are funding 46 active multi-year grants totaling \$27 Million that are specific to Childhood Cancer.

On June 15, 2024, the Salem Lions in conjunction with the team Cathy's Angels will be the Gold Together Sponsor with American Cancer Society at Pinkerton High School, in Derry, NH at the Relay for Life. ENVIRONMENT

"Zero Waste"-you may hear that term a lot more often now. While reducing the number of materials we put into our trash, either by recycling, re-using or even mulching, Zero Waste means looking at the whole system of how we use our resources.

A zero-waste system considers the whole life cycle of products. It includes manufacturers designing products with their "end of life" in mind. The life cycle of a product includes the production, distribution, usage and managing of their products until it gets to your door. This includes finding efficient ways to conserve our natural resources (timber, agricultural, mining and petroleum) while minimizing its impact on the environment. The **Zero Waste International Alliance (ZWAI)** was formed in 2003 to promote positive alternatives to landfill and incineration and to raise community awareness of the social and economic benefits-it has to be a Global effort and supported by local communities...

But on an individual level, zero waste means: making intentional purchases of necessary items that we can easily reuse, recycle, or compost at the end of their "useful life."

Tips for living a Zero Waste Lifestyle: do not take a bag for small purchases, avoid one-time holiday decorations, remember Styrofoam is **NOT** recyclable, compost food waste, donate old items, use travel mugs, cloth instead of paper towels, hankies instead of Kleenex- the list goes on!

Kudos to the several Lions Clubs that have pledged to become a Zero Waste Club by purchasing dinnerware made of sustainable materials like bamboo or wheat straw and/or compostable dinnerware. Products can be found on <http://mygreendish.com> or on Amazon.



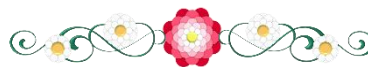


Windham


