## PCC Robert Gustafson, Diabetes Chair

The <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates</u> that 38.4 million people in the U.S. have diabetes.

<u>Diagnosed vs. Undiagnosed</u>: Out of those 38.4 million, 29.7 million are aware they have diabetes, while 8.7 million are unaware.

<u>Prevalence</u>: This means that roughly one in five adults with diabetes in the U.S. are undiagnosed.

<u>Public Health Concern</u>: The high number of undiagnosed cases highlights a significant public health concern as early diagnosis and management of diabetes can help prevent or delay serious complications like heart disease, stroke, blindness, and kidney failure, <u>according to the Illinois Department of Public Health</u>.

# Jeri Maynard, Environment Chair

If you attended the District Rally held at Camp Pride, you might have noticed a large container labeled "COMPOST". To some of us that is just a pile of rotting stuff but to gardeners, it is future "black gold". So why would those gardeners value a compost pile so highly? The many benefits of composting ranges from waste reduction (in landfills), to improved water retention(sandy soil) and enhancement of our soils (adds nutrients to plants).

Compost is "decomposed" organic matter that is mixed into the soil. These organic sources come in a mixture of two forms: <u>Carbon-rich Brown:</u> leaves, shredded newspaper, twigs and <u>Nitrogen-rich Green</u>: fruit and vegetable scraps, coffee/ tea grounds, egg shells and garden weeds. What not to put in your Compost pile: meat, dairy, oily products, pet waste, diseased or invasive plants, grass clippings that have been treated with pesticides or herbicides.

Composting is free and eco-friendly and just about anyone can make compost- even "city dwellers and those with a small yard. Just find a spot in the yard or use a container on the back porch or patio!

Some concerns about doing so are the fear that it might smell or attract nuisance animals. <u>Solution</u>: add water to your pile and turn-over the pile frequently - doing so will speed up the composting (usually takes a while to "mature"). Your pile will be available to use when it is "dark and crumbly" with an earthy smell.

Every club is challenged to do an environmental service project the week of April 18-26, 2026. Why not start a municipal compost pile **NOW** that would be available to your community members for their summer (2026) gardens.

This is just a very brief introduction to the world of composting. There is so much information out there... To get further information, instructions and "hints", contact:

#### **Phishing Information**

#### Fake IDS:

In the last few days we are seeing many phishing emails that look like a "I need to initiate an outgoing payment via Zelle/Paypal. I tried reaching out to (anyone of us), But i haven't heard back from both parties yet! Would you please kindly assist with this payment? If so, kindly let me know so I can provide you with the details needed to initiate payment, I'll have you reimbursed as soon as I can. Thanks!

If you receive such an email, please do not click on the link or on any part of the email, but delete it and then delete it from your deleted folder.

### More details about phishing:

#### DO NOT

- DO NOT open any suspicious email based on the Subject or Sender—delete it before you
  open it.
- DO NOT reply to, open attachments from, or click on URLs from unknown and untrusted sources.
- DO NOT use your company email address for personal communications.
- DO NOT ever send personal/sensitive information via email—e.g., passwords, credit card number, social security number, or account number.

#### <u>DO</u>

- DO check for misspellings, grammatical errors, and abnormal spacing that may be indicative of a phishing email.
- DO check links by using your mouse to hover over the hyperlink to determine if the URL makes sense with the sender—e.g., matching the sender name to the URL; whether there's a foreign name or location in the URL.
- DO report any suspicious emails—even if you're not sure, for investigation. (Please do not forward the suspect email)
- DO use common sense—if it doesn't look right, trust your judgment.

#### **RED FLAGS**

Does the email ask for any sensitive/personal information (password, credit cards, SSN, etc.)? Does the email ask for sensitive information about others?

Does the email ask you to immediately act or open an attachment to avoid account closure? Does the hover-text link match what's in the text?

Does the address in the 'To' field match the sender of the email?

Be vigilant, and be safe online.

All club members are able to view information in the Lion Portal. Here's how to see the service that has been reported for your club.

Login to the Lion Portal:
 <a href="https://lionsinternational.my.site.com/s/login/?language=en\_US">https://lionsinternational.my.site.com/s/login/?language=en\_US</a>.
 Your email address is your username. You may need to create your own login if you have not logged into the portal since it went live in April 2024. Follow the on screen prompts if you need to create an account.



- When you are logged in, click on the blue My Club tile.
- Then click on the Club Service Activities tab.
- Summaries are displayed for Total People Served, Total Volunteers, Total Volunteer
  Hours, Total funds Donated, and Total Funds Raised. This information comes from
  service activity that has been reported through either your President, Secretary, or Club
  Administrator.
- Use the filters along the left side to change your search.
- You can also widen the column headers for easier viewing.

Your Club President, Secretary, and Admin can pull reports on this information through the Data Export tab.




