DG ELECT'S MESSAGE



Our First Vice District Governor, **Roaring Run Lion Evan Gillett** and Second Vice District Governor, **Westminster Lion Richard Crunkilton** will be working with me to keep District 22-W the best district in Multiple District 22.

We recently **lost 2 Lions Clubs** to disbanding: Halfway Lions Club and Oldtown Lions Club. That brings us to 57 Lions Clubs and over 1900 Lions members in our district. Membership is a problem in most Lions Clubs in North America. We need to stop membership decline by finding innovative ways to find new, quality members for our Lions Clubs. We must think out of the box and abandon the old ways "We've Always Done It That Way" and allow new ideas for service and fund-raising projects in our clubs. I am asking our Global Service Chair Susan Cox to promote at least 1 additional, new service project for each of our clubs. Lions are volunteers who help those less fortunate than ourselves. Don't think of what you do in Lions Clubs as a job. Sure, we work hard to raise money, and sometimes it seems more like a job. But always remember that Lions are volunteers, not paid employees. When a new Lion asks to help, never tell them that they are not needed. Give them a job and make them feel welcome and needed. Lions work hard raising money that we give back to those is need locally and around the world.

The new Lions goal is to serve **200 million people** each year and give away **\$300 million** in 3 years. Lions Clubs International sets the bar high, and we always meet the challenge, and even raise the bar in most cases. Our district raised over \$80 thousand for Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) last year. That was remarkable, and we want to thank each Lion individually and each Lions Club for contributing to that great cause. A special thanks to LCIF Chair **PDG Kent Eitemiller** for leading that effort. Our new LCIF Chair is **PDG Paul Canada**, and I know he will work hard to lead the LCIF effort for 2018-2019.

1ST VDG ELECT'S MESSAGE

On June 16th, many Lions gathered at the Myersville Fire Hall to participate in a Women and Families workshop. The main idea was to discuss ways to get more women to join our Lions clubs and how to make our clubs more family friendly. One of the main reasons this workshop was put on was because within the district about 35% of Lions are women but women are 51% of the population.

Lions Clubs should be a welcoming environment for everyone, an inclusive atmosphere where everyone can contribute. Many of the discussion at the workshop are universal to all Lions: meetings need to be fun, topics need to relevant for the group, and stay on schedule (do not run Long). Women (like men) like to laugh, smile and be entertained. One thing that I took away from all of the participants at this work shop was the fact that women preferred the service projects with a direct connection to someone in the community. The best example of this was a fundraiser for the medical need of a specific person.

Here are FVDG Evan's top five ways to get women!

- 1 Invite a lady to a club service project. Do not ask them to join the club, ask for their help on the project. After the project is over, then ask them to join the club.
- 2 Make it a contest; the Lion stud of the year. Set a time period, three months for example, and challenge each club member to bring as many non-Lion Ladies to club activities and service projects as they can. At the end of the time period total up the number of women who came and award the winner a prize.
- 3 Form a women's committee within your club, made up of only women, and have them come up with a new service project for your club to complete. If it appeals to the women Lions in your club it will likely appeal to women who are not members.
- 4 Go where the women are: work with your local government agencies that focus on women, find a support group for single moms, develop a relationship with a local youth sports teams or associations. If you are in those places where women are, be prepared with information about your club because when you interact with these ladies they will want to know about your club.
- 5 Make sure the women in your club are happy with being a Lion and feel useful. These happy Lions will be your best recruiters of other women. Find a way to publicize these active happy Lions in your local media.

If you have a better way to get more women into Lions, I would love to hear your ideas. Lion Nadja Muchow will be sending out information from the workshop. These are ideas for your club to use, please try one or two of them and let her know what you have done and how it went. The idea is for the district to grow in membership and service.



On Tuesday, June 5, the Hagerstown Lions Club hosted the annual scholarship awards of the **M.H.R. Foundation. Scholarships were presented by foundation president Lion Jerry House** to six worthy students. Four students attended and two could not be present. The awards are for \$1,000 each.



Lion Jerry stated that recipients can be considered again for a scholarship if they are continuing to do well in college and other activities, but they have to ask to be considered again. Some recipients have been awarded previously but they have to ask to be awarded again. The awards originally were given to students attending Hagerstown Junior College but are now offered to students attending any college.

Lion Jerry thanked Smith, Elliott, Kerns & Co. for donating funds for the recipients and family members' meals which they have done for many years. He also announced that a club member will provide matching funds totaling \$5,000 for donations made by others to the Foundation.

Also, Lion Tim Peters is helping with the printing of the foundation's scholarship brochures. The brochure lists the current scholarship recipients and the amounts awarded each year from 1988-89 to 2017-18). The brochure also has the criteria for acceptance and other important foundation information. Fourteen scholarship applications were rated by the Evaluation Committee. Scholarship funds are paid directly to the colleges, \$500 each semester attended.
