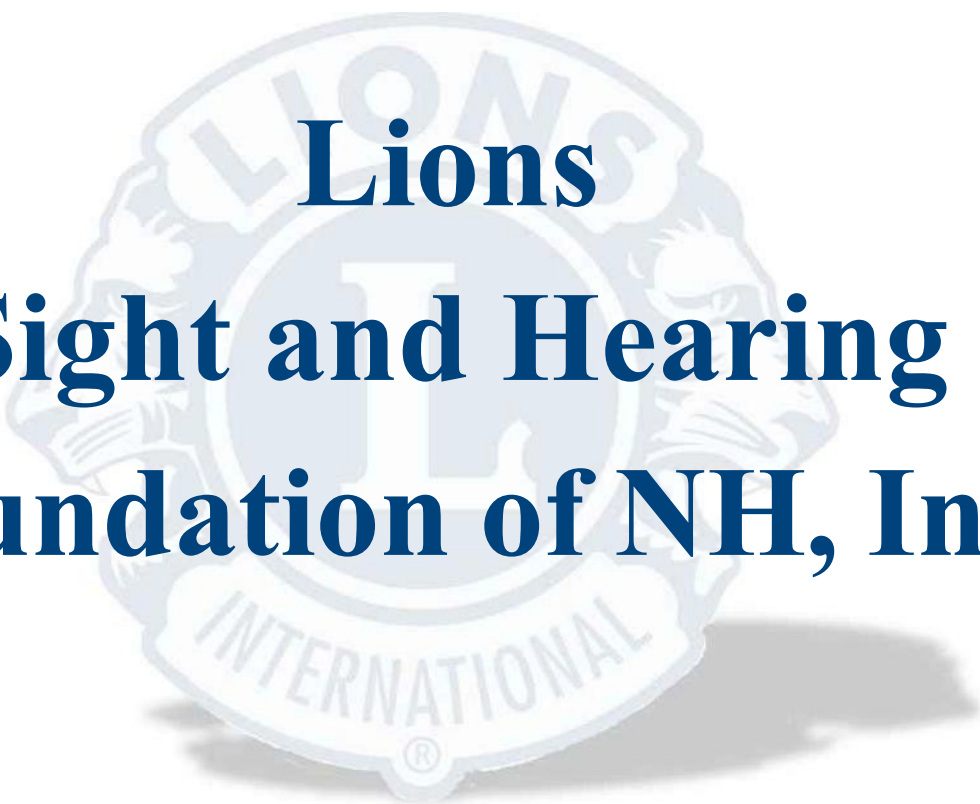

On behalf of the Board of Directors of the Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation of NH Inc., I would like to thank all New Hampshire Lions of MD 44 for your continued support in our mission to assist the citizens of our State with sight and hearing issues that local Lions Clubs may be unable to fund on their own. The Foundation also assists the northern part of our state where there are no Lions Clubs.

Established in 1978, the goal was to create a perpetual endowment, which as of 12/31/2025, is \$1,374,124 that would be available for generations to come. For this to happen, a 5% withdrawal per year limit was established. Since inception our foundation has distributed over 1 million dollars in sight and hearing assistance to those who qualify within our financial guidelines. This past year we worked with Future in Sight, Northeast Deaf and Hard of Hearing Services, and the Miracle Ear Foundation. We are excited about continuing our work with these organizations. In the 2024-25 year that ended on June 30, 2025, we funded 36 projects totaling \$37,629.00. This year we have currently funded 20 projects totaling \$21,117.88.

A few of the ways we raise these needed funds each year are as follows:

- Lions Twin State Soccer Association matches each summer since 1975. Please support their scholarship program and attend the games;
- NH Charitable Gaming, club, and member donations;
- Granite State Fellow presentations, NH Lions' highest recognition. When you or your club present a GSF to a Lion, non-Lion or Local businesses, those funds go directly into the endowment fund.

Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation of NH Inc. is a 501c3 Charitable Organization. All donations from Lions and other sources are tax deductible.

All Lions in Multiple District 44 (New Hampshire) are members of this great foundation and are the reason we have been successful for 46 years, and with your continued support our efforts to provide the needed assistance will go on! We Serve!

Annual Meeting Minutes January 25, 2025 Courtyard Marriot, Concord NH

President PDG Henry McKee opened the meeting at 9:40 AM with about 80 Lions present. He introduced the Board members present. He reviewed the cases for the FY 2023-2024 ended June 30, 2024. We had 38 cases – 54 hearing aids, 3 cataract surgeries, and 2 ear mold additions, costing the Foundation a net of nearly \$17,000. We meet at the Airport diner monthly in a hybrid format with some joining by Zoom. All NH Lions are members. We have partnered with the Miracle Ear Foundation, with criteria like ours. Annual reports are available. We are reaching out to support Future in Sight and the Northeast Deaf and Hard of Hearing to help them.

The financials were audited by Lion Norman Roberge and PDG Jerry Vaccaro. The audit letter is in the annual report. Through December 2024 we had \$1,372,390 in all accounts.

One of our fundraisers is the Granite State Fellow award, the highest NH honor that can be given. We now have 639 Granite State Fellows and 69 Progressives.

For the Board, we have 3 openings for District 44N, and 3 have stepped forward – PDG Marie Hall, Alan Hoye, and Brian Rater. For District 44H, we have two openings, and one has stepped forward, MCC Kamal Masand. PDG Henry opened the floor for nominations in both Districts. For District 44H, ID Steve Middlemiss volunteered. PDG Henry asked for a motion to close nominations. A motion was made, seconded, and voted upon, unanimously, to close nominations. A motion was made, and seconded, to have the Secretary cast one ballot for the candidates. This passed unanimously.

Secretary Fred Plett moved to accept the audit report. This motion was seconded and passed unanimously. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Secretary's minutes for the 2024 annual meeting, which passed unanimously.

PDG Henry closed the meeting at 9:55 AM.

Dear Board of Directors:

On this date, November 16, 2025, PDG Jerry Vaccaro of District 44H, and Lion Norman Roberge of District 44N, completed the audit of the books of the Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation of NH, Inc. All records for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025 were submitted to the auditors in electronic format. We evaluated all reports, materials, and accounts kept by Lion Brian Rater, Treasurer for the Foundation for the period of July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.

All records, transactions, (deposits and expenditures), were found to be in good order. The Foundation treasury reports were balanced and were consistent with third party reports (bank and investment firm).

We proved the Beginning and Ending Balances of the Checkbook:

Beginning Balance: July 1, 2024, \$13,483 per TD Bank, and \$7,563 per Foundation books; there were five outstanding checks totaling \$10,420 which were all cleared in the year under audit.

Ending Balance: June 30, 2025, \$45,070.45 per TD Bank, and \$21,064 per Foundation books; there were 9 outstanding checks totaling \$23,999 which all cleared in July 2025. The Investment accounts are held by investment firm RBC Wealth Management with a balance of \$1,299,809 and a Money Market account of \$1,032.

We reviewed and agreed with the ending fund balances of the Foundation as shown in the, June 30, 2025, financial reports: Unrestricted Fund Balance \$20,176, Endowment Fund Balance \$1,301,158, and a Restricted Fund Balance of \$571 which consisted of: Miracle Ear \$571.

We wish to commend Lion Brian Rater, Treasurer, on the quality and organization of his work and reports during his year as Treasurer of the Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation.
