Lion Barbara reported that Lion Jean Bartow has been selected as one of three Oklahoma AARP honorees of distinction when the 2024 Andrus Awards for volunteers were announced on December 4th. AARP will be donating \$1,000 to the nonprofit of her choice that she has designated as the Laverne Lions Club. Lion Jean is humbled and thrilled to be able to donate the money to her club where it will be used to give back to their community.

PVCC Mary and I are getting on the road again as I am doing much better. We traveled to the <u>Lomega</u> <u>Lions Club</u> on December 4th with the intention of helping them sack Christmas candy for the elementary stu-
