About 130 children are diagnosed with cancer in B.C. each year. All patients under the age of 17 who might have cancer are referred to BC Children's Hospital.

Childhood cancers look different and grow differently than adult cancers and also respond to treatment differently. Treatments can affect a child's growth and development. Childhood cancers respond well to treatment and children with cancer have a better chance today of living a longer life than ever before.
