



Submitting your Service Report is like sending an email.....

When you draft an email, you check that your email addresses are correct, the subject line is filled, you've got the details in the body of your email, and any signatures and attachments are included. But if you don't hit the SEND button, it doesn't go anywhere.

Same thing when you report your Service Projects on the Portal. Whether it's the Secretary, the Club Administrator, or any member of your club filling out the Service Project report, you go through the steps, add all the information requested, note the details, number of volunteers and volunteer hours, how many people served, any funds raised/donated, select the right category code (one of the Global Causes?) and then hit SAVE when you get to the bottom; but you're not done yet. Now, at the top right of the screen there's a white box with green letters that says Report to LCI. That's like the SEND button on your email. Click that, and now instead of saying Ready to Report, your activity is shown as Reported. **Secretaries: Please check your Service reports** and if there's any that show as Draft or Ready to Report, please finish them up, so they are completed.
