2026-2027 LIONS YEAR



IMPORTANT DEADLINE

New club officers should be entered into the Lion Portal by:

MAY 15, 2026

Reporting early ensures they receive necessary materials and have access to the system for training and planning.

For the 2026-2027 Lions International year, new club officers should be entered into the Lion Portal (formerly MyLCi) by **May 15, 2026**. While the new fiscal year does not begin until **July 1**, reporting them by this earlier date ensures they receive necessary materials and have access to the system for training and planning.

KEY DATES FOR OFFICER ENTRY



APRIL

Hold elections & begin entering new officers.



MAY 15, 2026

RECOMMENDED DEADLINE
for materials & system access.



JUNE 1, 2026

FINAL DEADLINE
to avoid system transition issues.



JULY 1, 2026

*New officer terms
officially begin!*

IMPORTANT NOTES



**EARLY ACCESS =
STRONG START**

Add officers early so they're ready on Day 1.



AVOID LOCKOUTS

Clubs not updated by June 30 may lose access and need International assistance.



**UNIQUE EMAILS
REQUIRED**

Each officer must have their own email address reported in the system.



HOW TO REPORT

Use the Lion Portal (MyLCi / Club Central) to update your incoming officers.

1. Pop-Up Litter Blitz

Pick a visible area (parking lot, park, or downtown block) and do a 1–2 hour clean-up.

- No permits usually needed
- Bring gloves, bags, and go
- Great for quick impact and photos

2. Reusable Water Bottle Giveaway

Set up a small table at a busy spot and hand out reusable bottles while encouraging people to reduce plastic waste.

- Pair with a quick conversation about sustainability
- Can be done in a couple of hours

3. “Plant-a-Pot” Mini Project

Buy small plants or flowers and decorate/plant them in pots to give away to seniors, schools, or community members.

- Simple, hands-on, and visible impact
- Easy to do indoors if weather is bad
