- People living with diabetes are two to three times more likely to live with **depression**.

In recent years, an annual 6.7 million deaths are due to diabetes —

1 in every 5 seconds
(International Diabetes Federation).



Diabetes accounts for 11.5% (US\$966 billion) of the global health expenditure (International Diabetes Federation).



It is estimated that by 2030 there will be **643 million adults** ages 20-79 living with diabetes (International Diabetes Federation).



About 3-in-4 adults with diabetes live in low- and middle-income countries. (International Diabetes Federation).



Promote education and awareness by taking one of several free online courses by the International Diabetes Federation to better understand diabetes. Consider featuring the courses in a club service activity and sharing with your district and multiple district.



Bring people together to raise awareness about diabetes on <u>World</u> <u>Diabetes Day</u> — November 14. Share your impact with photos, videos and other assets on social media using the #WorldDiabetesDay hashtag.



Develop a diabetes resource list by connecting with a local health department or hospital. Use the <u>Club and Community</u> <u>Needs Assessment</u> to address your community's specific needs.



Organize a weekly walking club or yoga event to promote healthy living.



It is important to know the risks of diabetes. Check out this online **Diabetes Risk Assessment** and share with your community.



Work with community health organizations to distribute diabetes supplies to individuals who may not have access to adequate tools to manage their diabetes.


