Monthly Spotlight: VISION



Did you know that more than **1 billion** people around the world would be able to see if they could just get a pair of glasses! It was 1925, just about 100 years ago, when Helen Keller spoke to the Lions attending the International Convention. She became both blind and deaf at 19 months of age due to an unknown illness. She asked the Lions to be the Knights of the Blind, and since that time, Lions around the world have stayed committed to helping people with vision loss. From collecting used eyeglasses, to providing seeing-eye dogs, to teaching people how to use their White Canes, and even travelling to third world countries to administer a single dose of medicine that prevents river blindness, Lions have been heeding the call to serve the blind and those with vision impairment. It's something to be very proud of, and next we will be celebrating the 100th anniversary of our commitment. Learn more by visiting www.lionsclubs.org.

It's been almost 30 years since the first pairs of used eyeglasses were shipped to Calgary to the newly formed Canadian Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centre, and there's no stopping us now. Just ask Barry Shiles from the Surrey Central Lions Club; his front porch is a regular drop off site from clubs who've been collecting used eyeglasses. He noted that he has even had a box of glasses shipped to him from Haida G'wai. All these boxes of used eyeglasses, and all the assorted parts, are shipped free of charge to our recycling centre in Calgary. The glasses are sorted, catalogued and then shipped to third world countries in need. They receive donated eyeglasses from Lions Clubs all across Canada, with 40% of them coming from British Columbia!

It's a fantastic, ongoing service project that makes a huge difference in the lives of those who need it.





The Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides has seven programs including vision. hearing. autism and facility support dogs.

Canine Vision Dog Guides assist Canadians (14 years or older), who are blind or visually impaired. These Dog Guides are trained to safely navigate obstacles typically found on daily routes. These Dog Guides can assist individuals with the following:

Stairs and crowds
Reduce stress by providing a sense of safety
Find doors, seats and crosswalk buttons
Provide companionship
Assist in using public transportation

The Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides is the largest of its kind in Canada, and the only one in the world with seven programs.
