Working through the African Mission and Healthcare group that is subsidized by such non-profit groups as Samaritian's Purse and the many others, along with private donations, all the while he teaches the young African medical students and nurses his skills. healthcare professionals, who already speak the language and understands the culture of the patients they will be treating... helping the patients feel more comfortable and understand what's happening.

Dr Sund is doing his part in closing the gigantic gap in African healthcare, where there are only 3% healthcare workers and only 5% of the people have access to safe surgery. He is truly a blessing to all he has taught, treated and help improve medical facilities in the small villages.
