#### From the Board



- -President Galen announced that Board Meetings will now be held at 6:30pm on the first Thursday beginning with the April meeting.
- The project with Lynden Kiwanis is still in concept mode and Lions Debbie Anderson and Jan Newman volunteered to meet with them.
- -New Officers for 2025-2026 were discussed and all members are encouraged to apply for any office of their choosing. New slate is needed by the end of April.
- ~Lions Jan Newman, Chuck and Nancy Boies have 'retired' from their positions when their current term is completed.
- -Our scholarship committee met recently & changes in the cover letter to School Counselors will be amended to include Technical schools, 2 year Colleges and all Universities. The Board voted to increase scholarships to \$2000 each with 3 scholarships available.
- -Lion Art Van Allen voiced concerns that lumber for the KART Project changed by the CBP from personal to commercial & fees now apply to transport it from Canada to the U.S. He's not sure if the new tariffs will apply to shipments of the donated lumber.

Our 26th year of our Veterans Celebration had a new twist this past November 14th! Our Club treated our Veterans and their guests to breakfasts at one of three local restaurants here in Lynden. ## January

General Meeting of Jan 9, 2025... Our first meeting of the year was called to order, the Pledge Of Allegiance was recited and a invocation given, we began with introduction of guests for the evening. Among them was Patrick Campaign, a member of Mountain View Lions Club in Anchorage, Alaska. He has recently been working as a volunteer doctor with the Haskell Eye Clinic (sponsored by Bellingham Central Lions). When asked about his home club's projects, he mentioned that he heads up a program offering free health care to under privileged in the area and has many local doctors volunteering their time to serve. It has been very well received and appreciated for over a year. Funds for the project come partly from LCIF, local businesses and donations from private parties.

Our first speaker for the evening was a returning guest, the founder of the Lynden Branch of Backpack Buddies program, Tammy Yoder.

Her last visit with us was right after the inception of the program beginning with one elementary school in Lynden. But soon grew to another and another, especially during the 'covid years', when the program grew tremendously with the mandate of online schools. Today, the program includes all the schools in Lynden and serves more than 140 students in need. BPB distributes



nutritious foods that need little preparation to those kiddos who must fend for themselves on weekends and school breaks, including summer, while adults work long days.

This is another successful program that we will continue to support, keeping them in our yearly budget. President Galen presented Tammy with a \$500 check for her dedication and many hours with Backpack Buddies.

Our January 23rd Dinner Meeting... we had the privilege of listening to Aaron Newcomb, cofounder of ENGEDI REFUGE.

The refuge is a holistic haven for survivors of sex trafficking, who are

searching for safety and restoration from their previous lives.

Meaning that physical safety and emotional stability with education and skill development prepares them for independent living where they can maintain their own health and safety with as sense of peace.



This means providing all the tools needed from housing, food, clothing and personal items to including medical and spiritual attention too!

This group of professional educators and many volunteers take NO GOV'T funding, only from local businesses, churches, grants, and individuals who

have made it all possible since their inception in 2013 right here in Lynden. At present there are now three 'safe houses' here, each housing 6, serving 18 at a time. Accepting women over 18, who are ready to overcome the negative effects of years of sex trafficking. Survivors are accepted from all over the U.S. there are now Engedi Programs in some other states, following the same protocol, and some are for men only. And it all began in Lynden!

At present, Mr. Newcomb reported a success rate of 90%. Engedi Refuge was presented with a check for \$500 from our Club for their continued good works.

General Meeting,,, February 13

President Galen Laird called the meeting to order with 22 members and 2 guests in attendance.



Our first guest was Emma Glassgow, director of the Boys & Girls Club of Lynden, which is an after school program for students ages 5 thru 18. All Lynden school students are eligible to attend especially the underprivileged. Their programs are valuable in teaching positive role models. They provided quiet spaces to accomplish homework and someone to help if needed, encouraging, exercising mental

fitness with plenty of books and games.

The club's goal is to teach young people about the benefits of developing good habits such as eating smart and being physically active as they also provide recreational sport programs for all ages.

The Lynden club's attendance averages 60-70 students daily M-F. The cost for each student is \$40.00 per year. Additional Donations from our community, along with grants help fund the successful program, Our Lions Club was no exception.

Our Zone Chairman, Terry Bronkema was also here to remind us all of the upcoming District O Spring Convention this year being held at the Swinomish Casino and Lodge in Anacortes on March 21-22. Registration can still be made at the conference, however meals may not be included.
