
#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

## **Whistle Stop Shows Donation**

As many of you are already aware, the Fair has converted the Dairy Barn into their Hobby Building. A while back, they asked us if we knew of any train layouts that were looking for a home. We got a call early this year from the museum indicating they were interested in finding a new home for the circus train we had given them almost 20 years ago. moved it and set it up for the Fair this year; it drew a lot of attention and was great advertisement for our train show. Lion Char was still in contact with Debbie Morgan. She and her husband Mike (who passed 4 years ago) had built a circus train layout they called Whistle Stop Shows. They had come to our show for over 30 years. Char happened to mention that the Fair was looking for train layouts for the hobby building. She said it was still in the trailer and she had no idea what she was going to do with it. She was very excited and relieved that it would have a home. So Char, Woody, and Chuck drove to Spanaway and pulled the trailer to Lynden. We set it up at the show this year, then loaded it up and parked it in the hobby building. It will be set up this coming spring for the Fair next year. We are also in the process of getting a G scale circus train layout donated to us for the Fair next year. This layout will be quite an attraction in the hobby area. We will have a lot of work this Spring getting them set up for the Fair.

As Cindy Alsum, the OperationsManager/Memorial and Family Service Advisor for Gillies Funeral Home was introduced, she had the full attention of all those present, speaking on a matter that make some people apprehensive but an important one to all of us;



'End of Life Planning'

Gillies has been a prominent name in Funeral Services to Whatcom County beginning in the 1920's. Beginning with 2 Mortuaries, one in Sumas and later in Lynden. The business was partially owned by a few partners throughout the years, but always involved was the Gillies family.

This establishment has lovingly assisted more than 5100 families since 1975. Always providing compassionate and professional care during their time of loss, offering traditional, memorial, graveside and cremation services.

Cindy spoke to us on how to begin the inevitable conversation before it becomes time for the decisions needed and how waiting makes it more difficult for the family when experiencing actual loss of their loved one, coping with grief, sorrow and suffering, adding to their emotional stress.

She was also very helpful in answering our questions and sharing with us all, copies of her "Thoughtful Decisions Guide' with topics for one to answer such as 'my wishes for type of service, overview of my life, precious memories along with vital info needed at time of death.'

I believe we all walked away with a more comfortable way to meet this need.

The General meeting of October 23 began with traditional Call to order, singing of 'My Country tis of thee' and the invocation.

Our speaker cancelled at the last minute so we had a short business meeting in their place. After enjoying the 'soup supper', including variety of breads and ice cream plus toppings for dessert, there were a few reports given.


The first three sessions of the Great American Toilet Paper Give-A-Way at the Hope Association Food Bank was a great success.
