#### General Meeting of Sept. 25 ...

After our meeting was called to order, we enjoyed a Pizza dinner first, then began our regular format of business, including a unanimous vote by the members to donate \$2,500 toward our last month's speaker, Dr. Greg Sund for his personal expenses to continue with his Medical Missionary teachings in Kijabe, Kenya for many years, along side his wife and three children (two now in college).

Our main speaker for the evening, David Vander Yacht, the Superintendent of Lynden School District for the past 2 years, working his way up from being a student to teacher, to Vice & Principal then to Assistant Superintendent, plus being a resident also. So he knows the community's





needs and wants very well.

There have been changes for the better concerning the Bond which will be voted on this Nov 4th. Along with a committee of citizens with business, project management and financial experience, our School Board came up with a much more affordable plan for the community now & for the future as Lynden keeps increasing in population.

Some of the key changes from the 2024 Bond will include a reduction of the project by \$28.5 million from \$157.5 million to \$129 million focusing ONLY on Lynden HS project! reductions to lower the cost for citizens while still meeting the students needs.
