This year, they raised funds with Junk-in-the-Trunk, See's Candy sales, and working the beer garden for Aqua Fest. You may have seen at Halloween or visited their Santa float this Christmas complete with elves and the Grinch. Their holiday raffle with a train set is always a treat.
