**The Francis J. Garner Memorial Fund** was established by the Benning Lions Club of Washington, D.C. in memory of Past President of the Lions of District 22-C Eye Bank and Research Foundation which was formally opened on March 1, 1957. This memorial fund, established in 1982, would be administered by the Eye Bank and would be used to assist persons in dire need who required eye surgery.

Since that time, the Lions of District 22-C Eye Bank and Research Foundation role has been redefined in its mission (no longer performing eye cornea replacement) and the Lions Community Outreach Foundation (LCOF) was formed. The mission of the Francis J. Garner Memorial Fund remained the same for vision related surgeries, but was enhanced in 2015 to provide financial aid to individuals who are in need of hearing related medical services.

The goal of the Francis J. Garner Memorial Fund is to provide financial assistance to qualifying candidates experiencing vision and/or hearing loss. The Garner Fund will provide up to \$2,500 in matching funds to assist Lions clubs and individuals to cover these vision or hearing related issues, subject to Lions Community Outreach Foundation (LCOF) board approval.

While servicing your community, think about applying for a Francis J. Garner Memorial Fund to help you in your mission.

On July 30, I received a call from the woman District 22-C Lions helped with eye surgery expenses in May. On 5 May an artificial tube was implanted in her one remaining eye to facilitate draining. A blockage was causing drastically increased eye pressure, which would lead to blindness.

She said she was in the Doctor's office having stiches removed from her eye on 29 July, and added that it was a painful process.

She apologized for not calling earlier, but was waiting until the stiches were out. Her doctor said the pressure in the eye was so greatly reduced that prescription medications she was on may not be necessary any longer.

Overall, she was very joyful. She expressed warm thanks to the Lions Clubs that helped her achieve this great result: Beltsville, Mt. Rainier Brentwood, Southgate Clinton and Takoma Park. Silver Hill Lion Susan Matthews made a significant personal donation.

Lions joined forces and made this happen. I extend my personal thanks to you.

#### LIONS SPONSOR BLOOD DRIVES



Every other month, St. Mary's County Lions Clubs sponsor American Red Cross blood drives. The schedule was necessarily disrupted by the pandemic, but Zone Coordinator, Lion Joe Joseph (Hollywood), says things are back on schedule now.

On Friday, 19 June 2020, Leonardtown Lions hosted the blood drawing at the Hollywood Volunteer Fire Department with Lions Theresa Fincham, Tim Twigg, John Brown, and Frank Nuhfer assisting in the collection of 55 productive units of blood for the Red Cross. This was the first blood drive under the COVID-19 pandemic protocols. Lions confirmed the appointment of each donor and took temperatures at the first checkpoint. At the second checkpoint, Lions scanned donor's card or driver's license into the Red Cross data base and ensured each had a current rapid pass or provided those without with a device to complete the rapid pass requirement. COVID19 protocols were followed with all equipment and furniture sanitized between donors.

Lois & Rich Barb DONOR HIGHLIGHT A Plan for the Future

When Rich Barb, a Lions club member, was invited to visit Leader Dog in 2009, he thought his wife Lois might want to accompany him. "After hearing the clients speak—that was it! I had to get involved in Leader Dog and I filled out an application to become a puppy raiser," said Lois. In 2013, after raising two puppies, Lois became a Lion and has served as a Leader Dog Chair for her club ever since.

Two of the dogs the Barbs raised became LDB breeding moms, three became working Leader Dogs: one in Spain, one was issued to a Stanford University student and most recently, one in Mexico. The Barbs are now preparing to bring home their 10th Leader Dog puppy. Lois and Rich love representing Leader Dog throughout the state of Maryland, visiting Lions and Leos clubs with a Future Leader Dog (FLD) in tow and spreading the word about how Leader Dog changes people's lives.

Through her work sharing information about Leader Dog, Lois learned how important philanthropy is to ensure that the Leader Dog mission continues long into the future. She had already listed LDB as one of the beneficiaries of her IRA through work, but she knew it was time to make sure all her financial wishes were planned for. When she received an email from Leader Dog mentioning FreeWill, a free way to create a legal will, she and Rich took advantage of using this easy tool.

According to Lois, "The FreeWill tool was easy and took less than 20 minutes to complete. It just walks you right through the steps." She said that the hardest part in creating her will was deciding how much to leave to her family and how much to leave to Leader Dog.

Our annual golf tournament had to be cancelled due to the on-going coronavirus pandemic. In an attempt to mitigate the financial impact on our fundraising, we are having our first ever "Virtual" Golf Tournament. For a mere \$10, each golfer can make a difference in the lives of legally blind people. This will be a fun event that you can participate in close to your home at a time convenient to you and your playing partners.

How it works: Form your own foursome and play at a

course of your choosing. Each golfer will play their own ball. The team score on each hole for the foursome will be the lowest score among the four golfers. Teams posting lowest score in relation to par receive prizes. **Cost: \$40 for a foursome (\$10/player)** 

To enter: Send check with completed registration form on the next page. Play your round between the dates of August 10-24 and send a copy of your scorecard to tournament director at coach13@zoominternet.net (Questions can also be emailed to this address).

Rules: Course must have a minimum par of 70. Golfers should use the following tees: men – white, seniors (over 65) - yellow, women – red. A golfer may play for more than one foursome, but a separate entry fee is required for each foursome.
