LA PLATA LIONS VISION SCREENING TEAM SCREENED 1026 CHILDREN

Members of the La Plata Lions Club vision screening team screened 1026 preschool children during the 2015-2016 club year. 222 children were referred to eye care professionals for further evaluation. Screening for the club year began in August, 2015 with the screening of 85 Charles County Head Start children. Then the team screened the children in Pre-K classes in the 22 elementary schools in Charles County, the F.B. Gwynn Center, and 7 private and church programs in the county.

The members of the vision screening committee are: Carolyn Rogers, chairman, Jordan Burick, Connie Burick, Jerry Batterton, Carol Batterton, Dale Bogdan, Jack Salyers and Sharon Bowle. Team members are proud to provide this free, volunteer service to young children as they begin their educational accomplishments. The school nurses in each program monitor the referred children for professional evaluation and treatment.

The La Plata Lions vision screening committee has worked with Mrs. Virginia Persinger and Mrs. Ramona Ritter, Charles County Vision and Hearing Technicians, since 2010 to provide vision screening to the Pre-K children in the Charles County Public Schools. After observing the use of the Plusoptix cameras at a community event, they requested the screening services when they perform annual vision assessments. The Plusoptix camera is a non-invasive camera that is used approximately 39" from the child. It detects vision disorders that may lead to Amblyopia (i.e. lazy eye). Amblyopia is a lifelong impairment that cannot be treated after early childhood – thus the screening of Pre-K aged children. Immediate and reliable results are printed out for referral to the eye-care-professional.
