

Goalball

Goalball is the only team sport specifically designed for the blind. It is played by men and women around the world, including in the Paralympics. MWABA launched its Goalball program in June 2015, by hosting a Goalball clinic at Trinity Washington University. Judo

Judo is an art, a sport, and a means of defense. Before learning to throw an opponent, or being thrown himself; the student is first taught the history, customs, and courtesies of Judo. The next lessons deal with the art of body protection (Ukemi, the art of falling without pain or injury); and the principles of balance. In addition to 40 throwing techniques, Judo includes: hold-downs, choking techniques, and armlocks... all of which can be safely used in contests of sport judo as well as self-defense. Adapting the sport to those with visual impairments simply requires participants to maintain contact while sparring.



Getting Started with MyLion Is Easy!

1 Download and register.

- Download MyLion from the App Store (iOS) or Google Play (Android).
- Open MyLion, confirm you're a Member, and tap **Create New** button. This is only necessary your first time.
- Provide a few pieces of information to tell us about yourself.
- Verify your identity with your Member ID and your personal email. **Don't have your Member ID? Can't remember the email address associated with your Lion record? No problem. You can get started without it.**

2 Create your personal profile (or club profile if you're the president).

- Tap the Person icon to customize your profile.
- Add your picture.
- Add your nickname.
- Tag your interests.

3 Create and plan a project.

- Tap the Activity icon to set up your first service activity.
- Provide details about your activity.
- Invite your club members and other Lions to help.
- Share your project on Facebook from MyLion.

4 Find other Lions and clubs.
