# Service Event Help Needed

Fellow Lions,

In 2014 the Beltsville Lions, with the help of volunteers from College Park, University Park and Mt. Rainier Brentwood participated in a health fair at the University of Maryland. Together, we screened 114 people in 2 days.

This year, there will be a repeat of the health fair on September 8th and 10th. The hours are 6 am to 6 pm daily. 4 vision machines are reserved. (The request I received said the hours would be 7 am to 4 pm, but my dentist is on the Board and says 6 to 6).

The event this year is the "Mid-Maryland Mission of Mercy & Health Equity Festival." The major emphasis is on free dental care. Dozens of dental professionals will be there in a well-orchestrated venue to provide free dental care to needy people, expected to number over 1,000. The University of Maryland School of Public Health will concurrently run a health fair there. They invited us (the Beltsville Lions Club) to participate again, and we plan to do that.

But this is a larger burden than the Beltsville Lions can handle alone. I assume we would get set up each day by 9 am and offer screenings through closing, whatever that is. The clients will receive dental care first suggesting we would not receive clients until afterwards.

The event is scheduled to be held in the Xfinity Center, University of Maryland. Access is easiest from University Blvd.

In case you are wondering, there is a football game on September 9th so they planned around that and will be holding the fair only on Friday the 8th and Sunday the 10th.

Clubs are asked to bring this up with members with the goal of identifying Lions willing to volunteer some hours in this effort.

Please contact Ted Ladd if interested in participating on either day for any period of time. Remember, Lions make the difference.

# Foundation of the Month

Lions Vision Research Foundation (LVRF)

Through the Lions Vision Center (LVC), the Lions Vision Research Foundation and Wilmer are committed to supporting low vision research and rehabilitation to minimize the disability caused by low vision and blindness. The Center's professional staff includes physicians, optometrists, research scientists, rehabilitation therapists, and ophthalmic technicians. Together they have created a low vision rehabilitation program that has become a model for clinics elsewhere.

The LVC has three integrated missions: research and development, education, and patient care in low vision (uncorrectable vision loss). All three missions brought to bear on the search for an understanding of the causes of low vision, better management of patients, and, ultimately, effective treatments.

#### What the Center Offers:

At the Low Vision Rehabilitative Service, a multidisciplinary team of doctors and rehabilitative specialists works closely with the patient, family, friends and the referring doctor to assist an individual in regaining function lost by visual impairment. This typically includes addressing vision issues causing problems with reading, driving and activities of daily living.

#### What the Center Offers:

At the Low Vision Rehabilitative Service, a multidisciplinary team of doctors and rehabilitative specialists works closely with the patient, family, friends and the referring doctor to assist an individual in regaining function lost by visual impairment. This typically includes addressing vision issues causing problems with reading, driving and activities of daily living.

Typical conditions seen at this service include:

Diabetic retinopathy Glaucoma Macular degeneration





Lion Bob Hayward was selected as the Lexington Park Lions Club Lion of the Year, in recognition for his outstanding commitment and contributions to Lionism at the local, district, and national levels. Lion Bob was our nominee for the prestigious Lions Club International Bull Thrower award.

Lion Bob joined the Lexington Park Lions Club in December 1996. Active from the beginning, Lion Bob personifies the ideals of Lionism. He accepted the position of Membership Chair in July of 1997 and served in that position for two years. Lion Bob then took on the responsibilities of King Lion, serving in that position from July 1999 to June 2000. In July of 2010, he again accepted the responsibilities of King Lion serving in that position until June 2013. Lion Bob has been our Secretary since July 2014.

Not only has Lion Bob accepted "official" leadership roles in the Lexington Park Lions Club, he is actively involved in all Club activities, most often taking a leadership role, e.g., our annual yard sale, our annual charity golf tournament, white cane days, and more. He is the consummate Lion, always giving of himself, his time and talents, and always encouraging others to become more involved. He is our strong right arm in all things Lion.

In addition to his many responsibilities with the Lexington Park Lions Club, Lion Bob has been a strong advocate for and participant in District 22C activities. He served as Zone Chair for Region 4, Zone 2, July 2012 to June 2014, Diabetic Chair since July 2014, and Treasurer for the Lions Youth Foundation since July 2013. He continues in those last two positions today.

Recognized by his peers for his outstanding contributions to his Club, the District, and to Lions Club International, Lion Bob was selected as a Melvin Jones Fellow in June 2000. He is a strong advocate for the military family and works diligently to include our service men and women in our activities, either as participants or as recipients of our services.

When asked what brought him to Lions, he cited a good friend's invitation and a memory from his childhood: "When I was in Kindergarten, I had trouble reading...the local Lions Club paid for the exam and glasses...."




