

## **HONOR ROLL**



### DISTRICT 22-C HONOR ROLL

The District 22C Honor Roll Award has been established to honor individual Lions who have rendered outstanding service to their clubs and their communities at the "Grass Roots" level over an extended period of time, who exemplify the spirit of Lionism through their unselfish dedication and who are deserving of Districtwide recognition for their efforts in the support of Lionism.

#### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Lions who have been members for five (5) years are eligible for nomination to the Honor Roll. Current members of the District Cabinet and current Club Presidents are not eligible and may not be nominated. Past District Governors shall become eligible five years after completing their term of office. Bullthrower Award recipients shall become eligible five years after receiving that award.

#### NOMINATION PROCEDURES

Each Club may nominate one member per year for the award. Nominations are to be in writing, signed by the Club President or Secretary, and shall explain the reasons that the nominee is considered deserving of the award by providing a description of the nominee's service and activities in support of Lionism. A form letter, provided by the District may be used to help facilitate the nomination process. Nominations may be submitted at any time during the year, but should be submitted to the 1st Vice District Governor no later than March 1st of the current Lions' year.

#### SELECTION PROCEDURES

Recipients of this award shall be selected from among the nominees by a committee consisting of the Zone Chairs and chaired by the 1st Vice District Governor. The number of award recipients selected by the committee may not exceed twenty-five percent(25%) of the total number of nominations. Additionally, the District Governor may name two Lions in addition to the number previously selected by the committee.

#### AWARD PRESENTATION

Honor Roll recipients will be announced at the annual District 22C Night. The names of of the recipients, together with the names of their respective Clubs, shall be inscribed on a master plaque that will be updated each year and displayed at 22C Night, the MD22 Convention and other 22C events. Each recipient will receive an award certificate. The final selection of award recipients will be based solely upon the above criteria.

#### DISTRICT 22-C BULL THROWER'S AWARD

The District 22-C Bull Thrower's Award originated in 1958 out of the Roaring Lions Program, a course in public speaking and leadership, aimed at better equipping Lion members to "sell" Lionism through the spoken word and self-confidence. Recipients had to be graduates of the Roaring Lions course and considered to have made outstanding contributions through their leadership to the goals and objectives of Lionism at the Club, District and International levels. Lion William "Bill" Mileham of the Washington Host Lions Club was the first recipient of this coveted award, and it has passed hands annually as a means of recognizing an outstanding Lion of our District.

#### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The criteria to be followed in submission of nominations are as follows:

The nominee has been a Lion for at least ten (10) years

The nominee is nominated by a Lions Club in the District

 The nominee has demonstrated a record of outstanding service towards the goals and objectives of his/her Club, District and Lions International

The nominee exemplifies the Lions Code of Ethics; and,

•The nominee has rendered volunteer services to the community in areas such as involvement with the visual or hearing impaired, youth groups, elderly, hospitals, churches, libraries, schools, fire and/or rescue organizations and the needy. The District Governor, Vice District Governors, District Governor candidate(s) and Vice District Governor candidates(s) are not eligible as candidates. The nominee need not be a Roaring Lion graduate.

#### SELECTION CRITERIA

The selection criteria, as specified in the District 22-CConstitution and By-Laws, Article VII, have changed slightly through the years. It is no longer a requirement that a potential recipient nominated for the award be a Roaring Lion graduate, but he or she still must be selected as the Lion in District 22-C who best exemplifies the desire as well as the ability to promote the spirit of Lionism.

A committee composed of the last five Bull Thrower Award recipients make the annual selection from nominees submitted and signed by the Club President or Secretary in the District based on both Lion and community involvement.

#### AWARD PRESENTATION

The award is presented at the annual MD-22 convention with the recipient's name engraved on the Bull Thrower trophy base plate, and is proudly held for one year at which time it is passed to the next recipient.

**Section 3. NOMINATIONS** - The nominations shall be submitted in response to a request for nominees mailed (or electronically mailed) to the club presidents and club secretaries by February 1<sup>st</sup> from the Chairperson, Bull Thrower's Award Committee. Nominations are to be submitted to the chairperson by April 1<sup>st</sup>. Nominations are not limited to members of the nominating club. The Chairperson will receive nominations and convene a meeting of the Bull Thrower's Award Committee for evaluation and selection of the award recipient. The Bull Thrower's Award Committee is composed of the Bull Thrower's recipients of the previous five (5) years. The Chairperson of the Committee shall be the award recipient with the earliest year. In the event that a committee member is unable to serve his/her term, the committee shall convene for the purpose of selecting a prior Bull Thrower's recipient to serve out the full term of the committee member who is unable to serve.





## **Lions Vision Research Foundation**



#### MD-22 LVRF TRUSTEES ANNOUCE NEW FELLOWSHIP ENDOWMENT

At the Lions Pride Luncheon celebrating 25 years of service of the MD-22 Lions Vision Research Foundation, the Trustees and our partners at the Lions Vision Center launched a new capital campaign to fund the Lions Vision Center Fellowship program in perpetuity.

MD-22 Lions have a right to ask, "Why should we do this?" The Lions Vision Center Fellowship program is unique. Dr. Robert Massof, Director of the Lions Vision Center reports "There are only 1-2 programs such as this in the United States". "Each year hundreds of applicants apply for the one position funded by the MD-22 Lions". "These candidates represent some of America's brightest medical talent". "At the LVC the Lions sponsored Fellow performs vital patient services, conducts clinical research, and receives advanced education in low vision technology and rehabilitation".

Lions International will celebrate 100 years of service in 2017. Why not make funding the LVC Fellow in perpetuity our MD-22 Legacy Project in support of Lions International's century of service?

In kicking off this new capital campaign the LVRF Trustees have committed to providing \$100,000 annually for five years while we work to establish the new Lions Vision Center Fellowship Endowment Fund. Making a Board commitment such as this gives credibility to the seriousness of the campaign and highlights the upfront investment the Lions are willing to make, particularly to potential donors outside the Lions organization.

Our partners at Wilmer Development estimate that we will need to raise \$2.5 - \$2.8 million to provide an annual yield of \$100,000 to support the Fellowship. There will no public date announced for completion of this goal. The Trustees and Wilmer Development will be silently monitoring progress as we go forward.

Are the Lions of MD-22 expected to raise all of this money? No. The situation is different than it was 25 years ago. The Lions Vision Research Foundation is now an established foundation with a solid record of accomplishment which should enable us to attract donations from businesses, organizations, and individuals. The Trustees are also embarking on a program to encourage donations from Lions Districts and Clubs beyond the borders of MD-22.

As with any MD-22 related fund raising campaign we are asking our member Lions, Lioness, and Leo Clubs and members to donate to this worthy cause. Donations to this campaign must be from new sources. While we build this fund we must continue financial support for annual operations through Vision Days, Annual Giving, and LVRF fundraisers. Clubs are encouraged to host special fundraisers and to seek donations from supportive businesses, organizations, and individuals in their local service territory. Personal donations from Lion members are also welcome. The Arnall Patz Fellowship can be used to recognize donors to this campaign.

Donations to this new campaign should be noted as donations for "The LVC Fellowship Endowment Fund" in the memo section of checks or with an accompanying letter. Donations should be mailed to MD-22 Lions Vision Research Foundation, P.O. Box 1714, Baltimore, MD 21203-1714.

As our International President says "It is just one more mountain to climb". Please join us the climb to the top! The view will be amazing.
