
To All Lions of Lions Clubs



It's truly amazing what can develop by one email.

All of you are aware of District 23-C's gown project. Our goal was 1000 gowns. We have about 25 gowns left to sew and about 150 to deliver. We will have given out 1200 gowns. We exceeded our goal by 200.

Many of you are aware that PIP Jimmy Ross is a special friend to our district. We absolutely adore him.

Occasionally our gown supplier would forward to me a gown request that he has received. We discuss it and most of the time we fill it. Last week-end he sent me one but this one was unique. It was from a nursing home in Allen, Texas. The nurse pleaded for some gowns because she could not find any and her staff may have to resort to wearing trash bags. We discussed it and I volunteered to contact the District Governor of that district, District Governor Vinad Mathur. I sent DG Vinad an email with a copy to PIP Jimmy Ross explaining our gown project and a copy of the letter from the nursing home. DG Vinad responded that he would like to learn more. PIP Jimmy Ross sent me an email stating that he was forwarding my information to a fellow Lion that may be interested in learning more. A few hours later, PCC Ernest "T.J." Tijerinia called me. PCC T.J. felt that the Lions of Texas may want to initiate our program in Texas. Several emails were exchanged including an email blast to all the District Governors in Texas.

The end result is:

- a. Lions 23-C sent 20 gowns to DG Vinad. Most will go to the nursing home with a few held back to use as samples.
- b. Our Conn supplier has agreed to donate 300 pre-cut gowns to the Lions of Texas. Unfortunately, due to his

production schedule they can't be cut till the week of June 8th. In the interim a 2nd Texas district is interested. We sent 30 precut gowns to Lion Lucy Gonzales. She will create a team of Lions that will work with our Lions to learn how to sew these 30 gowns as a pilot program as we wait for the gowns to be cut or the Lions can agree to have them shipped asap and they will cut them.

c. A third Texas district has expressed an interest in participating.

Our little gown project in Connecticut may become a project in the Great state of Texas. We're honored!

- waiver We have waived all charter and entrance fees from July 1 December 31, 2020.


These measures will help Lions facing financial hardships, and give our clubs hope, encouragement, and an opportunity to start the new Lion year with renewed energy and optimism.
