Due to continued protocols, the 2021 National Memorial Day Parade was filmed for television only, and was not be open to the public.




Lions of Multiple District 22 (Delaware/Maryland/D.C.) and District 24L (Virginia) participated in this event.

#### Honor Band Update

Given all the obstacles presented to clubs this year, it is amazing how the clubs of District 22-C have rallied in support of the Honor Band Scholarship program. The following clubs made contributions this year, collectively topping donations from last year: Colesville, Leonardtown, Montgomery Central-Derwood, Southgate Clinton, Gateway, LaPlata, Damascus, Monocacy, Greenbelt, Sandy Spring, Takoma Park, Palisades-Georgetown, College Park, University Park, Lexington Park, Calvert, Bowie, Burtonsville, Silver Hill, Mt. Rainier-Brentwood, Rockville, Brandywine, Beltsville, Leisure World and Queen Lion Carol and Lion Charlie Stone (Damascus). Deep gratitude to each and every club that made a donation to the program.

The uncertainty of the plans for this spring complicated the normal process of nomination of students for the music program. Band directors were reluctant to provide student names to the program since we could not give details on when rehearsals were to be held or how we would maintain COVID protocols. Additionally, the University of Maryland campus was closed to outside groups such as ours and we were looking for alternate rehearsal space. We received fewer student nominations this year than ever before.

Without a spring performance, we are repeating our process from last year. Students who responded to the nomination will again receive credit as though they have played this year so they may be eligible to audition as seniors. Those who are eligible to audition for a scholarship this year will take part in a virtual adjudication that we are presently scheduling. Each of the eligible candidates have been with the program for at least 3 years, so they have all played at a C-Night concert in the past. With a reduced number of eligible students,

the scholarships this year will be in keeping with historical levels and excess funds will roll forward to next year when participation is expected to return to a more normal quantity.

As we emerge from our time of isolation, we look forward to again providing an exceptional musical experience to a wide range of students in our service area and showcasing their talent for you at a spectacular C-Night celebration. The support of the clubs in the District makes this program possible. The students appreciate your support and the opportunities this program provides to them.

## **Eyeglass Reimbursement Program through LCOF Garner Fund**

If a club's expenses for eye exams and glasses exceed \$500, they can apply to LCOF to get reimbursed for the amount that exceeds \$500 up to a maximum of \$2,500. So, if your club was to apply to LCOF for assistance, they would receive a check for \$622 (\$1,122 - \$500). However, clubs should wait until the end of the Lions year before applying because they may receive additional requests for eye exams and glasses. Please note, this is not a permanent program; it was established to help clubs in the current Lions year 2020-2021. After careful consideration, the International Board of Directors has taken action to remove the resolution from the ballot this year and to move the vote on the dues adjustment resolution to our 2022 international convention, with the increase to be effective in July 2023 if passed.

We believe that the dues adjustment resolution is the right investment in the future of Lions, but we also realize that our greatest priority is helping our clubs and members make it through one of the greatest challenges of our time.

I want to personally thank you all for your tremendous support, and for everything you're doing to protect the health and well-being of our Lions and our communities.
